# SIMPLY TASTY

#### **Broiled Blueberry Dessert: Yield 4 servings**

3 cups fresh blueberries 1/2 cup sour cream 2 tablespoons brown sugar

Divide blueberries among four ovenproof 8 oz. custard cups.

Spread with sour cream; sprinkle with brown sugar. Place on a baking sheet. Broil 4-6 inches from the heat for 3-4 minutes or until bubbly and sugar is melted.
