Our attentions are normally directed to things like raking the yard, fertilizing the lawn, spring planting, washing the winter residues from our cars, the winding down of the regular seasons for the winter sports teams and the playoff hunt, March Madness, the beginning of another baseball season, Spring Break and the like.

Unfortunately this year our thoughts cannot help being consumed by the unrest in the world today with Iraq and North Korea. As I write this, our Commander-in-Chief has issued an ultimatum, which has gone unheeded, and military action between our Armed Forces and the Iraqi Government, has commenced.

Whether we are in agreement with the decisions and the resultant military actions, we as Freemasons <u>must</u> remain loyal to our country and those duly elected to make these types of decisions.

And finally my brothers, may you, your families, and loved ones remain safe during this conflict, that when spring rolls around again next year, we may be able to revert our attentions to those things commonly associated with this time of year.
