Rumors...

The following is the definition of the word "Rumor" according to The Random House College Dictionary:

Rumor – 1. a story or statement in general circulation without confirmation or certainty as to facts. 2. gossip; hearsay. 3. *Archaic*, a continuous, confused noise; clamor; din. 4. to circulate, report or assert by a rumor.



Most Often, rumors are totally unfounded and without basis, yet I trust you will not be able to find a single sole who has not been hurt or otherwise adversely affected by one. Even in the "computer world" people are constantly hurt by rumors. Have you ever unwittingly erased important files from your hard-drive in an attempt to rid yourself of an unwanted and damaging computer virus, only to find that it was a cruel hoax? I know I have. Fortunately for the computer world there are web sites for checking on the latest hoaxes that are being bandied about on the Internet, www.snopes.com being one.

In the real world of day-to-day/face-to-face interpersonal communication we are not so fortunate to have a source for checking on the validity/merit of things communicated to us. Below is a "Dear Abby" column on the subject, which ran in the Burlington County Times on October 15, 2003:

Dear Abby: The three-question self-test you advised readers to give themselves before spreading rumor or gossip is reminiscent of Rotary International's Four-Way Test of things we think, say or do:

- 1) *Is it the truth?*
- 2) *Is it fair to all concerned?*
- 3) *Will it build good will and better friendships?*
- 4) *Will it be beneficial to all concerned?*

Asking ourselves these questions, before we inflict verbal venom on our brothers and sisters, makes us better and more fair-minded human beings.

While the repeating of unsubstantiated gossip is hurtful to anyone on whom it is inflicted, we as Mason's should be particularly careful to not perpetrate such cruel behavior on our fellow man, especially the brethren. We promise not to speak evil of a brother Master Mason behind his back. We learn that every human being has a claim upon our kind offices and we are instructed to do good unto all men, especially those who are of the household of faith.

Finally Brethren, we would be serving ourselves and fellow man, by not repeating, or even listening to, unsubstantiated rumor. If we must, at least consider the Rotary International Four-Way Test; but by all means, remember our lessons as Masons. We as Masons, are seen as Up-Right Men, and are taught to ever walk, act and conduct ourselves as such before God and man.
