On April 28, 29 & 30th, I had the pleasure of attending the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Jersey in Atlantic City, N.J. It was a time of enjoying Masonic Fellowship with the Brethren of the 19th District and meeting and greeting fellow Masons from around the great State of New Jersey. I particularly enjoyed it this year, for it seemed special to me, representing my Lodge as Worshipful Master. It was surely an enjoyable time for all in attendance and for all of us to shine before the public; certain to make you feel proud to be a Freemason.


Where Have The Brethren Gone?

WARNING – The following message may cause an intense feeling of guilt. If you do not wish to feel guilty, do not read on.

I sat at a recent meeting and looked to the sidelines. What a shame. This is what our fraternity has come to? We had virtually no sideliners. We have the membership. We are 250+ strong. We have brought in over 15 new brothers in the last two years. Over three hundred Beverly-Riverside Trestleboards go out each month. Yes, we have the numbers, but where are the brethren?

I have monitored the "crowd" at each regular and emergent communication and have seen the numbers go down as the months have come and gone. Of course we have our regulars, and I am very thankful for that. The members who attend regularly are those that seem to be running the show. With out these few, very little would get done.



Meetings are not the only place the brothers are not showing up.

Rehearsals are really suffering. Two Thursdays ago at a rehearsal for the upcoming MM degree a total of six officers showed up. One other brother showed; he is playing a craftsman's part. Seven brothers. A MM degree requires at least 13 officers and 15 craftsmen. 28 brothers are needed to put a MM degree on. Seven showed up for practice.

I am a pretty avid reader and web-surfer. I have read all the articles about the stress on the American male, and the distractions each of us face every day and night. Who will the zillionaire chose??!! Who will be my next idol??!! Television poses a threat to our society, but it is not the real threat. We also have to deal with family issues that consume our time. Not only must we make time for the next episode of CSI or ER, we also have to make time for our wife and kids (or grandkids). Although we espouse that family comes first, the family pressure is a threat to our society, but not the real threat.

What is the real threat to our organization? An organization that has survived for 300+ years? One word – APATHY. Apathy is sapping the strength right out of our organization.

According to the Webster's, Apathy is defined as 1. a lack of feeling or emotion: Impassiveness 2. a lack of interest or concern: Indifference.

Indifference...Unfortunately it is striking the nation as a whole. Voter turn out is pathetic. All organizations are suffering from poor turn out. Major milestone events are suffering from poor attendance. No one cares anymore.

I would hope our fraternity would be immune from such apathy. We all sought out joining. None of us was asked to join. We needed something and Freemasonry seemed to fit the bill. Not everyone found what they were looking for and they drifted away either withdrawing or letting thems elves be suspended for NPD. The rest of us though (250+) continue to pay our dues and call ourselves Masons. Obviously, not we have not given up wanting to be Masons or we would stop paying our dues.

Yet still, apathy keeps many away. We just don't care enough to drag ourselves out of the house for a meeting or event. We schedule other things during days we know there is a lodge function or event. Some great nights have been planned by enthusiastic Worshipful Masters who expected big crowds, only to be dis appointed by the lack of turn out. They even offer a free dinners and still no one shows up.

Not only must the WM worry about lack of turn-out to events, he must also worry about filling the chairs for degrees. Scramble making phone calls to other WMs who themselves are having the same problems. He should not have to do this brethren!

Each of us made a promise during our second and third degrees to attend regular meetings. Each of us promised to aid and assist our brothers. These two promises cover regular and emergent communications. Each month you receive a Trestleboard with a schedule of communications for the month. Rarely are there more than two. Two nights out of the month your lodge requests your attendance at the lodge hall. Health and business permitting. We have added family to this also. Unless your business, health or a family event stands in the way of coming to lodge, you should be at stated and emergent Lodge meetings. You made a promise to!!



If call yourself a Mason and are not coming out to Lodge meeting, then you are not living by the oaths you took – those that made you a Mason. And if you're an officer of this lodge, you really have no excuse for not being there.

Did You Know??

Did you know that Pleyel's Hymn's origins date back to 1791? And that the lyrics were written separately from the music? Here is some history of the men responsible for origination.

- Pleyel's Hymn was written by Ignaz Pleyel and published in 1791. Pleyel was a Mason and the Hymn was part of
 his '4th Quartet, op. 7'. In "Die Geschichte der Fraumererei in Oesterreich-Ungarn" by Ludwig Abafi, published in
 1899 in Budapest, you will read (Volume 5, page 288) you may observe in the list of lodge members for the year
 1784 that Ignace Pleyel was a Fellowcraft in Lodge "zum goldenen Rad" [The Golden Wheel ed.] in Eberau,
 Hungary. This lodge worked under the Provincial Grand Lodge of Hungary, Grand Lodge of Austria, till the
 suppression of Freemasonry by Emperor Joseph II.
- The Lyrics to this hymn were written by Brother David Vinton. He was a teacher of the Masonic ritual (primarily the York Rite) in the Southern States, having the most success in North and South Carolina. He is best known for publishing at Dedham, Massachusetts, in 1816, a volume containing a selection of Masonic, Sentimental and Humorous Songs, Duets, Glees, Canons, Rounds and Canjonets, under the title of "The Masonic Minstrel." Dedicated to the "Most Ancient and Honorable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons," brother Vinton sold 12,000 copies by subscription. It was in this volume that the words of the beautiful dirge used in the Third Degree is found.

- Bro. Vinton was expelled from the Craft. The details that led to Vinton's expulsion from the Grand Lodges of South Carolina, North Carolina, Connecticut, and Virginia, have always been a bit sketchy, but apparently relate to his taking liberties as a ritual teacher and writer. In 1821, Vinton was summoned by the Grand Chapter of Virginia to be examined on charges preferred against him by Franklin Lodge #4 of Royal Arch Masons, of which Vinton belonged. The charges were for "highly improper and unmasonic conduct." Vinton did not respond to the summons, so lost his privileges as a Mason in that Grand Chapter, and "throughout the world." It was publicly claimed within the craft that Vinton had made Mark Masters and Past Masters without a dispensation or a warrant.
- Brother David Vinton died in Shakertown, Kentucky in July, 1833. While on his death bed at that place, the Masons of Lodge No. 73 at Bowling Green, wrote to the Grand Lodge inquiring whether David Vinton was a Mason in Good Standing. The reply was in the negative. Brother Robert Morris, in writing about the circumstances of Vinton's life in the Masonic Journal, Volume 53, 1880, eloquently said, "And so the sweet poet and Masonic songster of the period died under a cloud, and his tombstone no emblem of the Craft could have."
