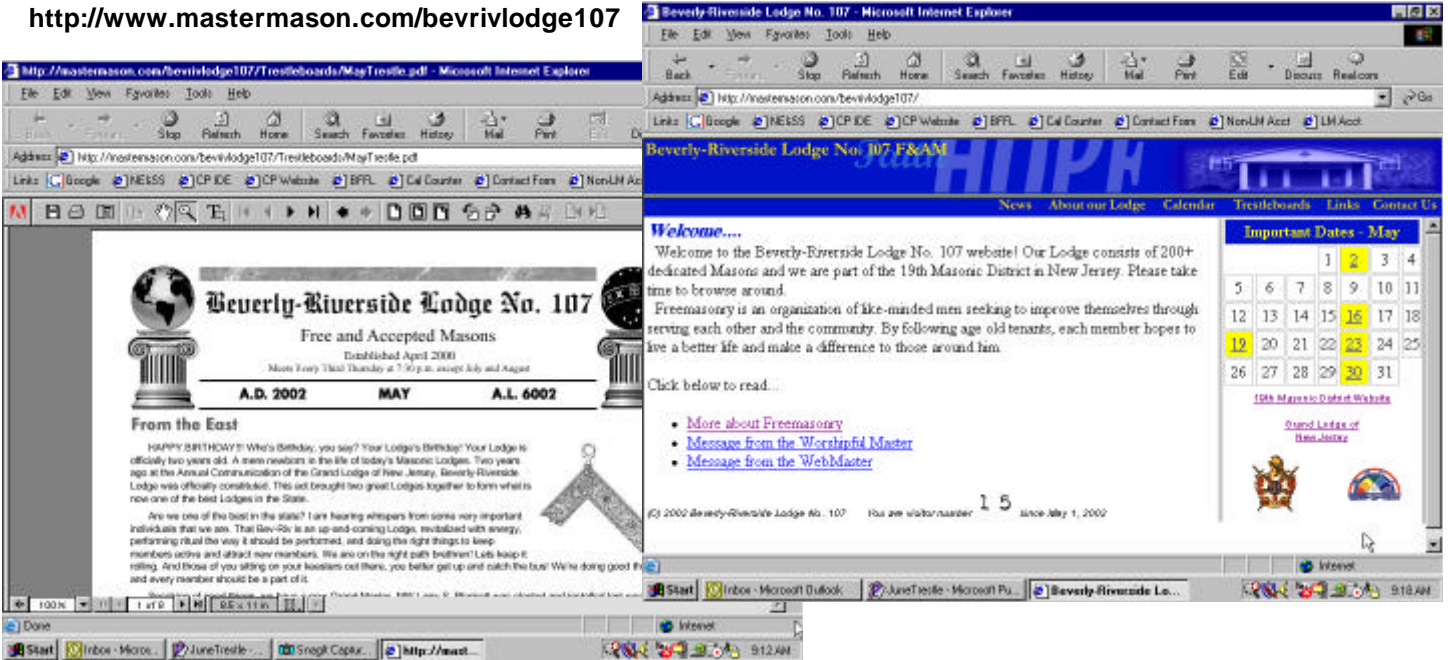

Just Do It.

This phrase became popular in the 1990s. It was coined in 1988 when a Nike Ad Agency rep said to a group of Nike employees, "You Nike guys, you just do it." This simple catch phrase became one of the most successful, if not THE most successful ad campaigns ever.

Just Do It. It is so simplistic that you wonder how every other advertising agency missed it the several decades before. This simple phrase conveys grit, determination and passion. Thinking about this phrase, aside from the fact that it made Nike a lot of money, I see how it can apply to many aspects of life today.

I have been thinking about this phrase a lot lately. I see people not going through with commitments. They always have some excuse. I see people wanting to do things but back out at the last minute for some reason or another. Perhaps they are afraid of taking on the responsibility that comes with taking on a new project or task. I think "Just Do It!" Stop making the excuses and get out there. Just Do It conveys responsibility. Just Do It – get it done. Take responsibility.

I coach a little league girls softball team. I would not have even contemplated taking on this burden if my daughter was not on the team I am coaching. This is the second year I have been involved, and I can honestly say, there is no other place I would rather be than with this team on the diamond on a Spring evening. These 7, 8, 9 & 10 year old girls are an absolute joy to be around. The emotions they go through during a game range from exhilaration to tears, laughter to anger, determination to disappointment. When they accomplish something as simple as an infield single, they are so excited they jump up and down. They get mad when things don't go their way. They get ice cream if they win. Everything in life accomplish in an hour and a half on the playing field.

If you have thought about becoming involved in a little league, but have balked because of time or fear– Just Do It. It will be a wonderful experience for you and your children. It will help some kids not as fortunate as others. It will help the community.

Maybe getting involved in a kids sporting activity is not your cup of tea. There are other things to get involved in. Thought about getting active in something outside of your normal everyday activities? Thought about the possible repercussions if something goes awry? Thought, "Why take a chance when NYPD Blue is on tonight?" Just Do It. The rewards are so great that it is worth the risk.

Just Do It applies to our Lodge setting also. We sometimes get stuck in the old ways. The way its been done for many years. Why change? We can stay secure in the way we are. Are we so secure? Take a look at the membership numbers in your lodge the last few years. Trying new things or taking the Lodge in a new direction can be risky, but the dividends can be great. Renewed interest, new members, and community awareness being just a few. Just Do It.

Why take the risk? Why should I step up and head that committee? It will take up my time, and I will get no thanks for it. Just Do It. Who knows what you can accomplish with the help of a few brothers and the support of the Worshipful Master. You will get satisfaction and your Lodge will benefit.
