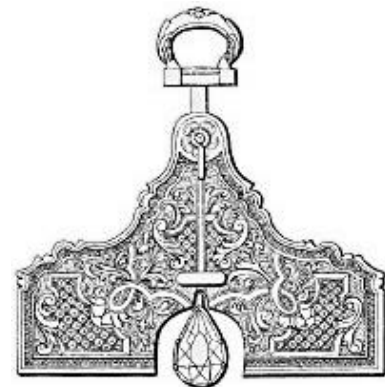
From the West

Only the Best

Only the Best!

We all sometimes want only the best, right? We may be making a purchase of something we have always wanted, like a new watch or even a car. Only the best will do. Maybe we are buying a special gift for a loved one. Only the best for you dear! Usually we have to pay dearly for "Only the Best". The best car could be vastly out of our reach. The best house in the best neighborhood could only be for the likes of Donovan McNabb or Mr. Smith, Esq. But still it is a good mentality to have. Especially in regards to work and play. "I will only give the best effort because, that is only right."

How about applying this philosophy to our Lodge. Only the best for our Lodge! The best ritual. The best repairs. The best decorations for our Lodge room or books for our Library. Sounds great huh? Nothing to good for our Lodge, right?

How about people? How about only the best people to be members of our Lodge? How about selecting only those that you think would be the best for our Fraternity?

For the last several years, our fraternity has be in an incredible decline. The vast growth experienced in post-war America is now in reverse as many of the men who joined during this period are leaving us. Thus, our fraternity declines to pre-W.W.II numbers.

In response to this, decline a panic sets in. What should we do? Our Lodge is under two hundred members! That will not do! We need to bolster membership now! Quick, grab that guy over there and that one there. Slap an apron on him and have him write a check. Who cares if we ever see him again as long as he keeps paying dues!

The result of this is declining membership attendance at Lodge meetings. The SW wrote about this in his column this month. Look out about the Lodge Room at meetings and you will not see many newly raised Masons. I congratulate and thank the ones that are there.

Should we be more selective in our "recruitment"? I think so. Many would say that we cannot or should not be selective in those we seek or allow for membership. "Freemasonry is for all men" some would say. I say it is not.

I sat in church this weekend and the celebrant was talking about our religion and the love of God. He told an anecdote about a person who was portraying themselves as religious but was not acting that way. He went on to say that no matter what we are or how we act, God will love us and always be the path to the afterlife. The tenets of our religion where applicable to everyone good or bad. God's love and our religious tenets are not selective.

That made me think of Freemasonry. Is Freemasonry selective? Some would say "No. It is available to all Freemen of Lawful Age." "If someone ask me about Freemasonry, I tell them about it. They have opened the door and I have a petition in my car for them." Is this good thinking? Should we open our doors to all who ask?

What about "Under the tongue of True Masonic Report?" What exactly does this mean?

Unlike our major religions, whose tenets are applicable to everyone rich or poor, good or evil, Freemasonry is only applicable to select few. A man has to have that good foundation within him to get the most out Freemasonry. "Making Good Men Better" is not just a catch phrase – it is the truth! Only a good man can see the true meaning of Freemasonry. Only a good man will make the most of our tenets and make use of the tools given to him.

"Under the tongue of True Masonic Report?" means that you have vouched for someone to be made a Mason. You have said "This is a good man who will be made better by our teachings." Does everyone fit this ideal? No. I have a fairly large circle of friends. Say maybe 15-20 close male friends and relatives. Of these 20, I would only consider 2 or 3 as possible members of our Lodge. That is pretty selective. I have spoken to two of them . One does not seem interested and the other is reading some literature about Freemasonry. Perhaps he will join.

Would I consider the others? Probably not. I don't think they meet the criteria of making a good Mason. In my opinion, they would not get out of Freemasonry what they should. They would lose interest and drift away from the Lodge. Thus we would have more empty seats at meetings.

The time has come to be more selective about who we make a Mason. We have to go out and get the best for our Lodge. Have a friend you know would be a good Mason? Talk to him about it. I am not saying ask him to join, but there are ways around that. The thing is to get him to ask you about it. Get him reading a brochure. Ensure him that you think he would be a great Mason. As long as you feel that he would.

The time has come for "Only the Best" men to join our Lodge. The best men will make us a better Lodge. And that is only good for us and the Fraternity.

The History of St. Patrick's Day

St Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17, his religious feast day and the anniversary of his death in the fifth century. The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for thousands of years. On St Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would dance, drink, and feast—on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.



The first St Patrick's Day parade took place not in Ireland, but in the United States. Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched through New York City on March 17, 1762. Along with their music, the parade helped the soldiers to reconnect with their Irish roots, as well as fellow Irishmen serving in the English army. Over the next thirty-five years, Irish patriotism among American immigrants flourished, prompting the rise of so-called "Irish Aid" societies, like the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick and the Hibernian Society. Each group would hold annual parades featuring bagpipes (which actually first became popular in the Scottish and British armies) and drums.

Today, St Patrick's Day is celebrated by people of all backgrounds in the United States, Canada, and Australia. Although North America is home of the largest productions, St Patrick's Day has been celebrated in other locations far from Ireland, including Japan, Singapore, and Russia.

In modern-day Ireland, St. Patrick's Day has traditionally been a religious occasion. In fact, up until the 1970's, Irish laws mandated that pubs be closed on March 17. Beginning in 1995, however, the Irish government began a national campaign to use St Patrick's Day as an opportunity to drive tourism and showcase Ireland to the rest of the world. Last year, close to one million people took part in Ireland's St. Patrick's Festival in Dublin, a multi-day celebration featuring parades, concerts, outdoor theater productions, and fireworks show. — Take From the HISTORYCHANNEL.COM website
