Grand Master Makes History!

Not everyone can attend the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Jersey every year. All Master Masons are invited and many do. I would say that over 1000 Master Masons attended this year's event at Atlantic City. If you were in attendance, you may have seen Masonic History made. For the first time in our history, Prince Hall Masons sat with us in a tiled Lodge!



This had been a long time in the making. Two years ago, MW Wayne Hackney, Grand Master at the time, invited a delegation of Prince Hall Masons to speak during the first session prior to the opening of Grand Lodge. Both the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New Jersey Prince Hall Masons and our Grand Master indicated their desires for mutual recognition and visitations. Their visit drew a standing ovation from the assembly.

Last year, MW Ferris Tryon continued the communication between our two Grand Lodges furthering the movement to the momentous occasion, which I had the privilege to witness last week.

At the 215th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Jersey, MW David Chase, following a wonderful Grand Master's speech, had only one recommendation to make - that was recognition of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge. The recommendation was received with a standing ovation from the assembly which made the Grand Master very proud and emotional.

Thursday, the Committee on the Grand Master's Address recommended immediate action on the recommendation. The Grand Master, using his authority, put two recommended changes to the Constitution and By-Laws to a vote. The first recognized the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of New Jersey as a Masonic Grand Lodge. The second would allow visitation rights. This change would be in effect following the adoption of a similar by-law by the Prince Hall Grand Lodge in June. Both changes to the Constitution were unanimously approved. The Grand Master immediately admitted the Grand Master of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge into the tiled Lodge room. It was wonderful and historic moment. Every member rose cheering the procession as they took to the stage to offer their greeting and salutations to our Grand Master. The Prince Hall Grand Master was as emotional and proud as MW Brother Chase. He thanked the Grand Architect for bringing this moment and heartily thanked the assembly for their support.

This event made the other legislation changes seem miniscule. But, there were other changes to the Constitution that bear mentioning. The per capita charge of the Grand Lodge Assessment will be rising beginning with the next dues notices. An increase of 75¢ was approved. This increase will be in addition to any insurance increases that will occur.

The Assembly also approved a change to the By-Laws that will place the GL Assessment on all brothers no matter what their status is in Lodge. Thus, a member that seeks to have his dues exempt including GL assessments, the Lodge will have to pick up the tab on the Assessments.

Three changes to the Constitution were defeated. One sought to increase the number of GL Trustees to nine from five. The other two sought to codify and define the dates of the Blue Lodge's elections and installations.

A third item up for vote was withdrawn from consideration.

RW Robert J. Sheridan was elected to the Grand South. He defeated RW Joseph H. Rival, Jr. Anyone who has been active in Lodge activities has probably met RW Brother Sheridan. He has a long Masonic resume and is a fine addition to the Grand Staff.

The only other contested chair in the Grand Lodge was for five year trustee. RW Harry C. Bingenheimer, Sr. defeated RW Richard Cadmus and RW Brian F. Johnson.

Congratulations to all the newly elected line. The work of the past year's line was exceptional and forever changed the landscape of New Jersey Freemasonry.

Masonic Light

Being Catholic I watch the news with concern about what is going on in the Catholic Church with the priest scandal. It is amazing to watch how the media creates mass hysteria over this. They seek out everyone with an opinion, especially a negative one, and throw their faces on the tube hoping to get a rise out of the audience and a rise in their ratings. They lead the masses in condemnation. They create such a stir that it shakes one of the largest institutions the world has ever seen to its roots. One of the most powerful people in the world is forced to take action. The power of the media.

Don't get me wrong, what these priests have done is so wrong that it is unfathomable. And the Church is wrong for attempting to cover it up. But, the church moves to a different beat than the rest of the now politically-correct world. The Catholic Church believes in forgiveness of the gravest of sins, thus they must forgive those who commit them.

The situation reminds me of a similar one that our Fraternity faced over a century and a half ago. The Morgan Affair. Almost every Mason has heard of the Morgan Affair, but for those who haven't here is a very brief recap:

William Morgan was an active Mason in Western New York in the early 1800s. Masonry was very popular during the early 1800s and with its popularity came those who avidly opposed it. William Morgan had attempted to join a local Royal Arch Chapter. The Chapter questioned his Masonic legitimacy. He became infuriated and vowed to expose the secrets of Masonry in print. He shortly disappeared and was thought to be murdered by Masons. He was really taken to Canada by Masons, given \$500 and told to settle there. His family would be taken care of and brought to him within a week or two. Before his family arrived he disappeared from Canada and is thought to have settled in the Caribbean.

Well, thoughts of murder and conspiracy surrounded the local Masonic community. Several public officials were Masons including the police officers and local Magistrate. Anti-Masonic sentiment exploded fueled by the already growing national anti-Masonry movements. This led to the darkest period in the history of our Fraternity.

At the time, Freemasonry was so popular, that a great number of political officials were Masons. The Anti-Masonic movement affected many political careers. It went so far, that another political party was formed, the Anti-Masonry party. The Anti-Masons thought that Masons in public offices valued their Masonic obligations over the public duties thus endangering everyone and deceiving the public.

The Anti-Masonry movement spread like wild-fire through the northeastern United States. It grew in such popularity that in 1832 the Anti-Masonry party elected its own presidential candidate to run against Past Grand Master, Andrew Jackson. WB Jackson had no problem gaining office as his popularity among the population was very strong.

The Anti-Mason movement had reached it's zenith at this point. Many Lodges in the northern part of the country went dark and never recovered. All of this because the population had a perception of what was happening and acted upon it. Such is the power of suggestion and mass hysteria.

Lucky for us today, that the real truth of our Fraternity is so strong as to withstand such prejudice. We are lucky that it survived this test and we can enjoy our Lodges and brotherhood.

I am sure that the Catholic church will survive this scandal and I hope that it learns a few things. Masonry was never the same following the Anti-Masonry Movement. It actually became better. It became more focused on charity. Perhaps the Catholic Church will learn from this "cleansing". Perhaps it will refocus on what makes all the worlds religions strong – its spirituality.
