John J. Randt will be recipients of this great honor. Here is a little description of the Legion of Honor that I gathered from various sources.

The Legion of Honor is the highest honor presented by the International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay, and is granted for outstanding leadership in some field of endeavor, and for service to God, country and humanity. Nominations are made by the Executive Officer and it requires a unanimous ballot of the Supreme Council in Session. The new recipients were elected at the Supreme Council Session this past June in Houston, Texas.

The Legion of Honor was founded for the purpose of bringing together a select few out of the millions who have knelt at the altar of DeMolay. Legion of Honor recipients must have actively demonstrated outstanding leadership in some field of endeavor, whether it be a civic, professional, fraternal or spiritual arena. # Masonic Light

This month we will be holding a Past Master’s Night in our Lodge. I am not sure if “Old Riverside Lodge” held Past Master’s Nights. In my short five years in “Old Beverly Lodge”, we never had one. I know several Lodges in our district that do have them, and I feel they are very important.

History in a Masonic Lodge is one of our principle tenets – “ancient usage and customs.” Being a Past Master makes you a living part of the history of our Lodge. Yes, all members are part of the history of our lodges, but the Past Master has a special part in the history. In most lodges, the Past Master has his picture placed in a prominent spot near the Lodge room. This is a testament to the importance of the Past Master to his Lodge.



As much as the Lodge has a duty to hold its Past Masters in reverence, the Past Master has several duties he owes to the Lodge.

First of all, he is an upholder of the Ancient Charges as he promised at his installation. This is one of his most important commitments – to maintain the Craft in its existing form and uphold the status quo. He is part of a group necessary to place a new Master in the Oriental Chair. He may be asked to be part of the Installation or Qualifying Team, and he should eagerly accept such a position.

He may be asked to hold an office in the Lodge such as Secretary, Treasurer, or Tyler. Such positions are very important to the Lodge’s proper function. A Past Master’s experience in the administration of the Lodge and his knowledge of the Craft will enable him to make sound knowledgeable decisions both inside the Lodge room and outside its door.

He may be asked to sit in an officer’s chair should the officer be absent that evening. Or he may even be asked to fill a position for a year to avoid “too big a jump” in the progression of the officers up the line. He should only be expected to fill this chair for the maximum of a year.

A Past Master may be asked to sit in a Lodge committee where his experience will once again be invaluable. Most committees will be composed of a Past Master, a sitting officer or experienced member, and perhaps a younger officer or newer member of the Lodge. While the young officer and member will bring new ideas and vigor to the committee, the Past Master will provide temper, knowledge and guidance. Such a combination will allow maximum productivity for the Lodge.

The Past Master also owes it to the Lodge to be a representative to the Grand Lodge. A Mason becomes a member of the Grand Lodge when he first becomes a Junior Warden. Now as a Past Master he has the opportunity and responsibility to attend all Grand Lodge Communications and meetings, especially the Annual Communication held in April of each year. As a Past Master he has a voice in the affairs and decisions of the Grand Lodge. His Lodge has a right to expect him to provide his voice as its representation.

For the Lodge, the Past Master is several things:

- He is a great resource of information about the Lodge. His knowledge of Lodge function and form will aid the line officers in their education and duties.
- He is a repository of the history of the Lodge. He can nowhere match the record of its minutes, but he will know things that may not be recorded!
- He is a guide for young and new Masons. He sets an example for newer members by his actions both inside and outside the Lodge room. He may be asked to be a mentor or instructor for incoming members. Although newer members will often be assigned as instructors for the purpose of the examinations, the Past Master's vast knowledge of the Craft can also be used. He may be assigned to some of the "lesson sessions" to be sure the craft is not being corrupted by good intentioned but less knowledgeable brethren.
- He is an advisor when advice is wanted. This is an extremely important point. All Past Masters have an opinion about how things can be done better. It is necessary that these opinions are restrained. Every Past Master remembers when he sat in the East, and his ideas were met with negativity. He should not have to go through this experience. It is the duty of the Past Master to make recommendations to the Master only when it is apparent that the Master is seeking them. He should uphold the Master's wishes and assist him in seeing that his orders are duly executed.

What a Past Master is not:

- He is not the Master of the Lodge and does not run the Lodge.
- He cannot correct the Master of the Lodge. The Worshipful Master is the absolute ruler within the Lodge.
- He cannot correct younger members of the Lodge without the approval of the Master on Lodge related matters.
- He is not the authority on any matter unless the Master and the Lodge accepts him as such.

The Past Master should conduct himself in ways that will ensure he earns the respect and reverence he deserves from the Lodge. When he is sitting in Lodge, the Worshipful Master should have his undivided attention. He should follow the rules of Masonic etiquette at all times when in the lodgeroom. He will provide an example to all members as to "how things should be done in open Lodge." He should again remember when he was in the East, and accord the same respect he expected during his term.

If the Past Master sees a new face in the Lodge room, he should make his way and be the first to extend his hand in welcome. He should introduce himself, sit and get to know this new friend. He can later take the opportunity to introduce the visitor to other Lodge members.

If the Past Master knows of a member who regularly attended but drifted away from the Lodge, he should reach out and contact the member and encourage him to come out to Lodge for the next communication. He should also make a point to contact other Past Masters to make sure they attend Lodge regularly if they have not been.

As everyone can see, the Past Master is an integral part in the life of a Lodge. His knowledge and experience are valuable assets that the Lodge can exploit to its benefit. His Lodge owes him a debt of gratitude for the years he served in the officer's chairs. He owes the Lodge for the experience of being in the "line". He deserves the respect of the Lodge, and he owes whatever he can give back to it.

Please accept this as a personal invitation to come out to the Lodge if you have not been out for a while. If you are a Past Master, I urge you to attend this month's meeting where we will honor you and your brother Past Masters before the brethren in open Lodge. We will have a dinner before the meeting. I hope you will make this important meeting and hope to see you all get more involved in your Lodge.
