LEO CORNER

Last Month we covered the foundation of the Grand Lodge of England in 1717, just a few short years later we see masonry spreading across the American colonies. English Modern, Scotland, and the English Ancients all appointed Provincial Grand masters to America, no doubt hoping to advance their influence on the colonies and American freemasonry. The first recognition of U.S. masonry was in 1730 when the Grand Lodge of England appointed Daniel Coxe the Provincial Grand Master of New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. Written documents show that Benjamin Franklin paid dues to a lodge in Philadelphia in 1731, although no other lodge documentation exists. The first recognized official Masonic Lodge in America was established in 1733 when Provincial Grand master John Price chartered "First Lodge of Boston" which still operates today as St. John's Lodge, under jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts.
