LEO CORNER

Masonry holds the Saints John's Days in high esteem and has throughout history.

When the 4 original lodges gathered to hold an annual assembly and select a Grand Master in England; they met on St. John Baptist's Day in the 3rd year of King George. (A.D. 1717) The first Grand Lodge of England elected and installed its first and following eight Grand Masters on St. John's Day. Years later after the division, and during the re-unification of the ancients and moderns it was one of the 21 articles of union that there would be "a Masonic festival, annually on the anniversary of the feast of St. John the Baptist" That can only show you the esteem that our ancient brothers held for this festival.

June brings with it the traditional birthday of St John the Baptist. At one time this summer festival and the later winter festival for St. John the Evangelist composed the two major church festivals. Technically these celebrations occur on a solstice and not an equinox, although similar. The equinox is when the sun will spend and equal amount of time above and below the horizon, this happens approximately every quarter of our calendar. The solstice not only coincides with an equinox of the sun but also adds the fact that the tilt of the earth's axis is oriented directly towards in the summer, and away in winter from the sun. Thus giving us the longest and shortest days of our calendar. Although not always on our stated St. John's Days of June 24, and December 27, the earth's orbit brings us these days without much variance. This year the two actual occurrences will be June 20 at 23:59, and December 21st at 12:04.

In the Entered Apprentice degree we learn of a circle with two parallel lines representing those saints. Do you know that the symbol of the St. John's festivals was the wheel? This helps us allude to "going around this circle" which is our travels throughout the year from the longest to shortest days, unbroken with the aid of our holy bible, which rests on top. Did you know that St. John the Evangelist is said to be the son of Salome, who was the sister of our Blessed Virgin Mary? Another tale from the ancient city of Benjamin, is that St. John the Evangelist was once asked to be grand master; He replied that being ninety he would take the office only to complete his Masonic learning, thus completing what St. John the Baptist had started by his zeal, thus drawing a line parallel, between the two; is there where our parallel lines come from? Our degree work, our ritual are from time immemorial and although today it's just the ritual, and we just do it the way its written, we should understand that it all started somewhere, those words represent or allude to a history of our ancient brothers passing on knowledge, and traditions we should not forget and continue to recognize, celebrate and pass on to future generations of freemasons.
