Where were you first prepared to be made a Mason?

Where were you first prepared to be made a Mason? The answer to this question is known by anyone who has advanced past the Entered Apprentice Degree. It is in the heart that a man is first prepared to be made a Mason.

The following is an excerpt from a 1987 report given by the Grand Lodge of Missouri's Committee on Masonic Education concerning the condition of a candidate's heart. "The heart is the seat of the affections, passions,

and desires. All the actions of a man's life issue and proceed from the heart. As a man's heart is, so will his life be. If his heart is clean and pure, his life cannot be wicked and vicious. Fundamentally. Masonry's first concern is with the strengthening of character in the individual - the building of a Spiritual Temple. Unless the heart is receptive the mind will not respond to this basic objective."

The lesson imparted here is clear. A lodge can accept the pe-

titions of a hundred seekers and pass them from degree to degree, but if they were not first prepared in their heart to be made a Mason, it is all vain works. As the old adage goes, 'it is not the quantity of men you make a Mason but the quality of them'. If a man is not prepared in his heart to be a good man, full of charity, before he enters the lodge, he will never become a Mason. His life will forever be "as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal." ∞

Luke 12:34: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.


In Memory of Joe Miller Womack, Senior Deacon Morgan Hamilton "Popeye" Marks
