## **Chicken Pie Fundraiser a Major Success!**

WOW, what a remarkable event this was for our lodge and others. If you were not able to participate in this fundraiser you missed an impressive opportunity to reach out into our local community on a massive scale, have a lot of fun, and potentially change lives for the better.

Between Friday and Saturday November 5th and 6th we made, baked, and sold about 1,900 chicken pies and served about 300 meals, but more importantly we shared fellowship with the brethren of our lodge and made many new friends from the Catawba Valley Aquatic Club (CVAC). Through this event we were able to use our Masonic trowel and spread the cement of brotherly love and affection. Since which time we have had 2 men in our community that participated ask for more information on how to become a Mason. This is incredible. Remember, we reap what we sew. If we continue to work in our community, we will ultimately continue to grow and prosper as a lodge. What a better way to light the pathway to our doors.

I want to personally thank the following people for their total commitment to this successful fundraiser; WM Dan Rolon for supporting the lodge in this endeavor. Brother Terry Moore for his financial contributions, selling tickets, arranging deliveries (and even provided a van for it), and ultimate chicken grinding skills! Brother Dan Wallace, for printing (free of charge) the pie tickets, meal tickets, and various promotional materials and signs and for encouraging us to start this project last year. Brother Doug Moore, for keeping track of all the needed raw materials, ordering, and picking up the 7 pallets of materials we used. Brother Fred Laxton, for his generous donation of cardboard boxes for hauling pies in. Brother David Crawley for allowing us to use his refrigerated trailer to store materials and pies. Brother JJ Kuba, whose culinary skills and ability to organize a kitchen staff are a fantastic asset and allowed us to meet our goals. Brother David Brandon for arranging the sell of 100 pies and delivery of those pies to the Corner Round Table in Newton (soup kitchen). It was my honor to be able to go with him and drop off these..... If you want to warm the cockles of your heart, go spend some time helping those in greater need than yourself. Brother Kevin Johnson for allowing us to publicly print his phone number for people to call in orders. Brothers Adam Beagles, Allen Lineberger, Daniel Guthrie, Paul Aulbach, Eddie Elliott, and Richard Rozzelle for spending the majority of two days of their time serving our lodge by working hard in various positions making sure this project was completed without a hitch. Not to mention all the ladies of the lodge that supported us and participated. We owe our special appreciation to Bro. Mike Davis, Master of Knights of Solomon Lodge #764 for traveling up from Charlotte and working with us most of the day on Saturday, as well as taking a good number of pies home with him. And each and every other Brother within the lodge that sold tickets, worked the event, and provided support to the lodge in any way. Without each and every one of your efforts we could not have achieved the goals we made.

I also want to thank Coach Paul Schiffel of CVAC and <u>ALL</u> of the swim team members and parents that assisted us. We had about 100 individuals that help us over a 3 day period. Their support was phenomenal and the amount of labor they provided, for three shifts a day, was simply amazing. There were times when we had so much extra help that we literally had to turn people away from helping us. What a great problem to have, right?? Collectively the CVAC team sold over 600 of the pies that we baked. Wonderful job! Most importantly, they have already requested to be a part of this fundraiser next year. Without the support of Camille Gruman at The Family Care Center we would most certainly not made the goals we set. The staff, friends and supporters of their organization was responsible for about 250 of the pie sales. She has told us that with more notice for next year she can assure us more sales provided we choose to work with her group. Although they will not read this, the approximate 500 pies we sold from walk-ins was enormous. Thanks to the Hickory Daily Record, WHKY radio, Hal Rowe, WCNC, and all the other advertising that promoted this. It definitely paid off for us.

# Collectively we were able to profit about \$7,500 that will be going to the local charities. This is outstanding!!

Single handily this could not have come to fruition. I hope that I thanked everyone involved and if not, it was not on purpose if you were omitted. Thanks to everyone and we hope to see you again next year.

As a result of this tremendous achievement we have purchased a new chest deep freezer that currently holds about 150 lbs of left over chicken and about 100 frozen chicken pies. The chicken we will be using next year for other fundraisers. Can't wait to have a splendid chicken-n-dumpling meal early next year. Stay tuned for more details.
