Hey to every one out there. I hope that the fourth was happy and healthy for all y'all and that the summer is doing every one well. I have been looking into the study of symbols and as you know the Craft that we follow is one taught by symbols and allegory. For good reason I think. I have also just recently dipped my foot into the vast experience of teaching and, just at the first blush, a lot has been revealed to me about the nature of the art and of the way that it is passed from one member to another.

The fact that we have an oral tradition is one of the factors we point to when trying to describe the age of the brotherhood. No one can actually tell you when we, as a race, first came across the ability to use the sounds coming from our mouths and create something that will allow us to communicate to one another. The best guess that I can find is that complex (i.e. god, glory, anything that is conceptual in nature rather than concrete in existence) thought was being traded orally somewhere around 50,000 years ago. That, my friends is a huge amount of time. Thinking only of the span of time that we feel is the history of our shared past is but a drop in the sea of all the knowledge that could have been discovered and lost over the intervening millennia.

Some say the way we exchange information has hit its peak. After all the written word has been around for almost 5 thousand years and the design in its most basic form has not changed all that much since they started to use cuneiform to keep track of the yearly harvest back in Babylon. Yes, I know what you are thinking, but look at all the great advances that have taken place since we first put pen to paper, yeah, yeah, yeah. I put to you my brothers that with this advance in human communication we have lost something of the mystic, something of the nature of God. I speak of a person's search for his own answers. The awareness and understanding that take place in a depth and enormity that can only be brought on by that "ah ha" moment. You see the human brain does not work in the $a + b = c$ concept. If it did then all things would have been figured out because pure logic would bring every one to the same conclusion. This does not happen, just yell the words "health care" at our next dinner and watch what happens. (Actually, note to self yell health care at next dinner. 2nd note to self bring video recorder to next dinner.)

The human mind works more along the lines of $A + _ = C$ and then B comes in a flash. This is the eureka moment that so many people talk about. And the direct ambiguity of symbol sets a person on the path to that moment, many for the first time in their lives, because they have been spoon feed all of their critical thinking through an educational system that is broken.

The written word has had a great effect on the community of humanity, but only, I feel in the passing on of scientific, or what is called scientific knowledge. The observable, the things that we can touch does a great job with this, but the things that we feel emotionally falls flat. Try to describe the feeling of you had at the birth of a child or the taste of your first shot of whiskey. It is indeed far outside of this writer's scope and talent. To the very few this is attainable but only to the reader that some how connects with a specific author's style and thought process, not to all of the possible readers. This is where the use of symbols was and still is so important not only to the Craft but also to humanity. Anything that pushes a person to think for themselves and gain understanding through only their own effort can't be bad. So I say to you brothers try some nonlinear thinking now and again. Let's try and turn the word "think" from a noun back into a verb. Until next month brothers try and stay cool .
