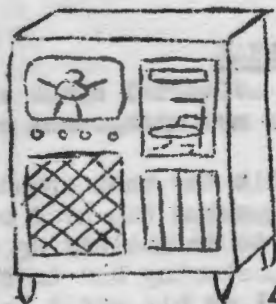

The various colored pyramids are worn by Cedars to denote certain working groups. Now--if you only have a green pyramid and want to wear one with a different color, see one of your officers, a member of one of the units--Stunt team, the Rangers, the Color Guard, the Degree teams, or Chief Frolicker and tell him you want to take an active part in Cedarism.

Watch how quick you will have a different color pyramid and also be up to your ears in work. It may be wise to check with the better half to know how many nights you will be allowed out to help with Cedarism. HOW TO WEAR YOUR PYRAMID

The Pyramid, being considered a part of the uniform of a Tall Cedar, a Cedar who has his Pyramid on will come to a right-hand salute when the colors are within six paces, BUT WILL NOT REMOVE HIS PYRAMID. After the colors have passed, he should drop his right arm.

In case the same Colors pass the same point again, as often happens in a Ceromonial Session or in Display Drills; the Colors need not be saluted again a second time. The same rule applies in street parades.

During the offering of a prayer in worship, during a Memorial Service, during the obligation in the Royal Court, while Flags are being posted at opening, and while singing the National Anthem, the Pyramid should be removed and held in the right hand over the heart.

Please govern yourself accordingly.
