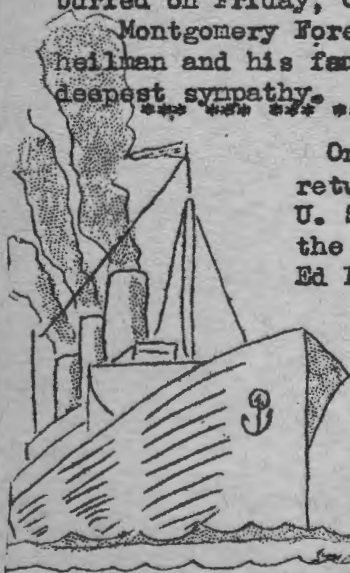

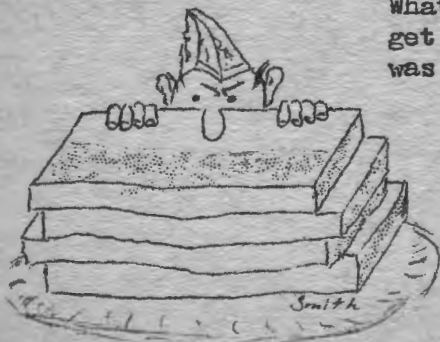

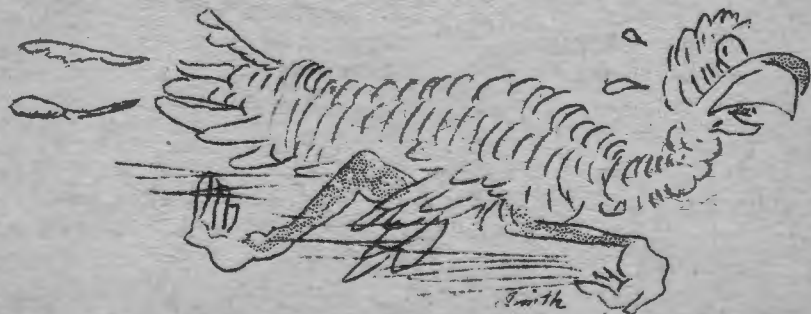
TURKEY SHOOT

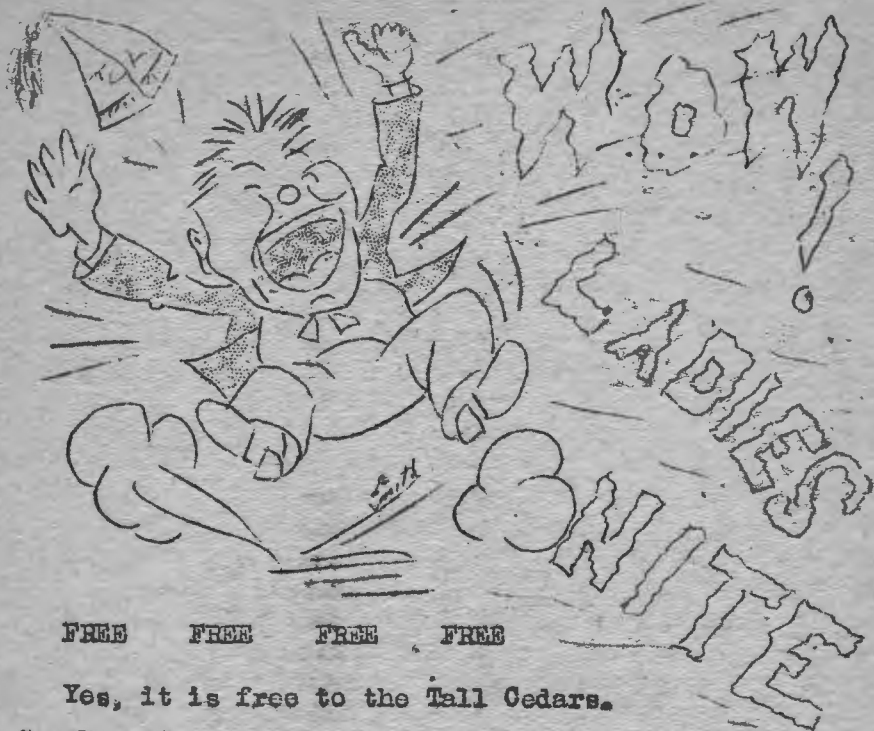

N. W. on Sunday November 16th. Arrangements are being made to have an inspiring message given to us.

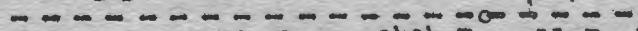
