The Hotel Committee visited Atlantic City Jan.
23 & 24 to inspect accommodations that had been offered by several hotels. An agreement was reached with
management of the EASTBOURNE HOTEL at INDIANA and
PACIFIC AVES. and a block of rooms has been reserved.

We are now prepared to take reservations and by the next meeting will have a list of rooms including the facilities in each. Reservations will be accepted with the payment for the expected stay on the basis of \$3.50 or \$4.00 per person per night, two to a room or \$5.00 per person per night, one in a room. You have a choice of rooms and bedding, either twin or double beds. All prices quoted include bath. However, the \$3.50 rate is based on a two room suite with bath between, minimum of four persons per suite. All prices are subject to 3% city tax and must be collected with the reservation.

By collecting in advance for your hotel lodging neither you nor the hotel will be bothered with collecting or paying bills on an individual basis. If you are elegible for part payment of your lodging by being a member of one of the Forest's Units, contact your Unit Head for the method that will be used.

NO RESERVATIONS CAN BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT FOR YOUR FULL EXPECTED STAY INCLUDING TAX. All checks should be made payable to the Forest.

Floor plans will be available for inspection later.

The Hotel selected is conviniently located to all convention activities and is one short block off the boardwalk directly behind the Claridge Hotel. It is 3 blocks from the Warner Theater and 5 blocks from Convention Hall. It has 97 rooms, 90 with bath. continued on page 6

Wa (Masons) have been assigned a complete block of numbers. Let's do all we can to promote and adversise this project so that we can use the entire block of numbers.

In order to obtain tags in the block of numbers assigned to us, it will be absolutely necessary that the following instructions be complied with:

If your adress is changed, notify the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles immediately,

We will not accept applications requiring change of address or new titles.

Fill out application for tags and be sure to SIGN YOUR NAME.

Write on the back of the application the name and location of your Lodge and 1951 tag number and also indicate if you are a Master or Past Master.

Turn in completed application with money to your lodge representative or to the undersigned as soon as possible after receipt of application card from the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles. Make payable to cash or to the representative, or to Rey T. Fowkes.

The amount of the check should be the fee stated on the application, plus the fifty cent fee to cover booklet and handling.

DO NOT MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO THE COMMISSIONER OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

Application for tags must be in by March 10, 1953

Attach to your application a self addressed 2 envelope, stamped, Post Office size #13. (3 3/4 X 6 3/4 or larger, so that we may mail you the "Who's Who Directory", listing all the names and tag numbers of our members.

Only applications registered in the name of a Mason, his Wife, his Unmarried Widow, his Unmarried Daughter or his son under 21, will be received. The number will be assigned to the Mason involved.
