EARL HAMMOND MEMORIAL

On Wednesday evening, June 2nd, Supreme Tall Cedar, Earl H. Hammond was involved in a serious accident while enroute home from a Tall Cedar affair near Glem Burnie. As a result of the injuries received in the accident, Brother Earl H. Hammond passed into the Shades of the Eternal Forest at 4:00 p.m. o'clock on Saturday, June 5th.

Because of the high regard held by Masons and Tall Cedars everywhere for Brother Hammond, at a Supreme Forest Advisory Committee meeting held on June 19th in Easton, Acting Supreme Tall Cedar Boyd R. Felty appointed a Committee to establish the "Earl H. Hammond Memorial Fund".

The Earl H. Hammond Memorial Fund Committee, consisting of Harold N. Hillegass, Chairman; Albert R. Hoffman, Treasurer; and Walter S. Leonberger, thoroughly investigated the immediate and future needs of the Hammond Family as well as other memorial possibilities. This Committee then met with the Acting Supreme Tall Cedar Felty and Supreme Scribe, Lea S. Jester on July 24th. The following resolutions were unanimously agreed to at this meeting:

- (1) That the official "Earl H. Hammond Memorial Fund" shall be established and information regarding the fund be disbursed to all Supreme Forest Officers, Past Supreme Forest Officers, Appointees, Grand Tall Cedars and Scribese
- (2) That the Memorial Fund shall be established in the form of a trust fund; and that the funds therein shall be disbursed, at the discretion of designated trustees, to Barbara Gail, Cynthis Sue, Judith Lynne and Earl Thomas, children of our deceased Supreme Tall Cedar Earl H. Hammond. The primary purpose of these disbursements shall be for the children's future education.
- (3) That the Memorial Fund shall consist of contributions from Tall Cedars, Constituent For-(Continued on page 9)

ests, Tall Cedar Districts, and other interested individuals or groups. These contributions may be given to any member of the committee, Supreme Forest Elected Officer or District Deputy Supreme Tall Cedar. Albert R. Hoffman, Treasurer, has opened a special bank account for the deposit of money received for this fund.

- (4) That a trust fund shall be legally established, with designated trustees, by May of 1966, and that this trust will remain open for future contributions.
- (5) That all contributions are to be strictly voluntary. It is expected that all Grand Tall Cedars and Scribes will accept the responsibility for making known to the members of their forests the existence of such a fund and its purpose.

PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGES



In the June issue of the Echo, a writeup was printed concerning four changes in the By-Laws of Montgomery Forest, on which action is to be taken at the September meeting. It is necessary to have the action at this meeting to make them effective at the time specified, and permitting approval by the Supreme Forest. Printed at the request of the Grand Tall Cedar.

Change Number 1:---

Add a subsection (a) to ARTICLE VI, Section A to read as follows:

(a) Nominations for the Offices as listed in Section A shall be made from the floor at the regular meeting held in October. When all accessary nominations have been made, they shall be closed upon proper movement and passage. Reopening of nominations may be made prior to balloting, at the November meeting, upon proper movement and passage of the Forest. Change Number 2:---

Add a section E to ARTICLE VI, reading as fellows:

E. The Editor of the ECHO, the Forest publication, as appointed by the Grand Tall Cedar in accordance with Section D above, and whose duties will be to assemble and edit material given him, and arrange to have the present mimeograph section or its equivalent ready for insert in the cover, shall receive expenses for his appointed position in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) annually.

Change Number 3:---

Change ARTICLE VIII, Section D, to read as follows: (Continued next page)

The Treasurer shall receive as expense of his office Treasurer Pive Dellars (\$25.00) Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) annually.

Note: Purpose to increase the expenses allowed the Treasurer from \$25.00 to \$35.00.

Change Number 4:---

Note: Purpose is to raise Forest dues to \$10.00 per year,

Change Number 5:---

Chrages required in ARTICLE X, Section C, to correspond to changes suggested in Change Number 4 above:
