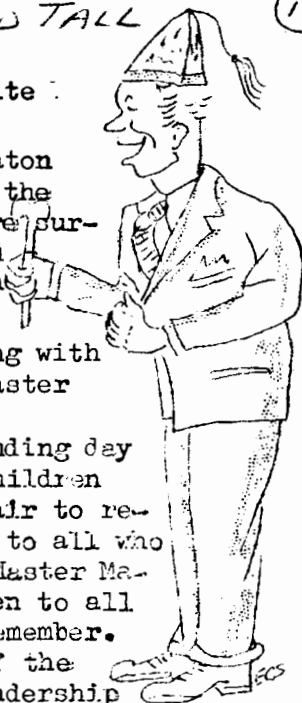
March 12th, we spent the evening with Capitol Forest, which was their Master Mason night.
