IN MEMORY

P.G.T.C. Harold G. Nicholas, affectionately known to his friends as "Nick" was born on May 11, 1909 in Washington, D.C.

Brother "Nick" remained in Washington, D.C. throughout his childhood and adult life and was one of very few true Washingtonians. He attended school here and after his schooling he began his working career with the Bureau of Standards where he served for 43 years.

On July 1, 1930, Brother Nick wed his lovely wife Gladys and the two of them began the partnership of marriage which continued throughout his life.

Brother Nick became interested in the Masonic Order and was initiated as an Entered Apprentice at Anacostia Lodge on February 16, 1948, He received his Fellowcraft Degree on March 15, 1948 and was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on April 14, 1948.

After Nick moved to Silver Spring, Earyland, he transferred his membership affiliation to Kensington Lodge #198 and soon thereafter became interested in the Tall Cedars of Lebanon. On February 21, 1953, Brother Nick was initiated into Montgomery Forest #134 and began his career as a Tall Cedar.

From the very first, Brother Nick showed his enthusiasm as a Mason and as a Tall Cedar by joining the Color Guard where he served as an active member until he was called to the Eternal Forest on January 7, 1972.

In the nineteen years that Brother Nick was with Montgomery Forest, he served his Forest with zeal and honor. He was elected to the office of Trustee in 1963 and served in this capacity until 1968. During this period, his interest in Cedarism Grew and soon he aspired to become Grand Tall Cedar and in 1969 he ran for the office of Junior Deputy Grand Tall Cedar and was elected to serve in this capacity.

Receiving the approval of his Prother Cedars to climb the ladder of Forest Leadership, Brother Nick gave his all to the Forest. He served as Chief Steward, as Ohairman of the Sick Committee and as Publicity and Entertainment Chairman as well as JDGTC in 1969. His record speaks for itself. In December 1969, he was elected to the office of Senior Deputy Grand Tall Cedar for the year 1970. His service to the Forest in this capacity was earmarked by the success of the Forest during the course of the year.

In December 1970, Brother Nicholas was to realize his goal and was elected to the office of Grand Tall Cedar of Montgomery Forest #134 for 1971. His sincerity and dedication to the Tall Cedars and their goals became more prevalent this year than ever before. His guidance, leadership, and interest in the Forest and its members was ever present and the success of his year was apparent.

on July 5, 1971 to prepare for the annual 4th of July parade in Takoma Park, Maryland. On this date the Supreme Architect of the Universe gave Brother Nicholas his first Call and on January 7, 1972 his will was fulfilled and our Brother entered the Eternal Forest.

Each of us lost a true and dedicated friend and the Tall Cedars of Lebanon lost an inspiration that can never be replaced. A man with such dedication comes along once in a decade and those that are fortunate enough to be affiliated with this individual have truly gained from this association.


Let everyone know that although we enjoy each other's fellowship, we still maintain a purpose in life beneficial to everyone.

CONVENTION





BY-LAWS CHALCE

At the January meeting of Montgomery Forest, the following change in the By-Laws were adopteds

Article X Fees and Dues

Section E

Suspensions -- any member, other than a Life Member, who fails to pay his dues by December 31st of the year due, shall be automatically suspended unless such dues are remitted by the Forest.

Pending the approval of the Supreme Forest, this means that you can not be carried over for a second year before you will be suspended for non-payment of dues. This change in the By-Laws were necessary because the per capita tax to the Supreme Forest has increased as well as the National Charitable Objective assessment. If the Forest carries a member over the end of the year, the Forest is liable for this additional amount, which can become noteworthy if there are many non-paying members who must be dropped. The answer is - PAY YOUR DUES PROMPTLY - at the beginning of the year, then come out and enjoy all the activities. Another thing, The Cedar Benefit Fund clearly states that you must be in good standing in your Forest to be eligible and that is spelled out as ONE year.


