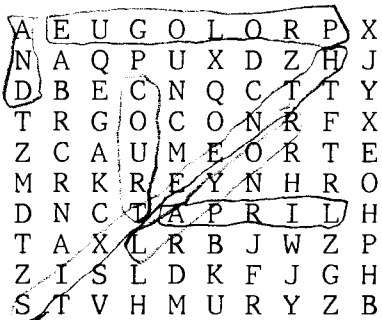

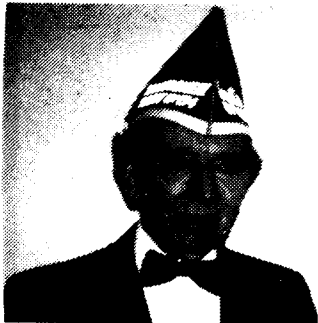
If you have PAID for your Booster and/or 365 Club and your name is not listed, please give me a call and I will have it corrected as soon as possible.
