

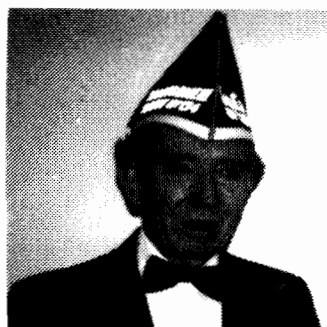

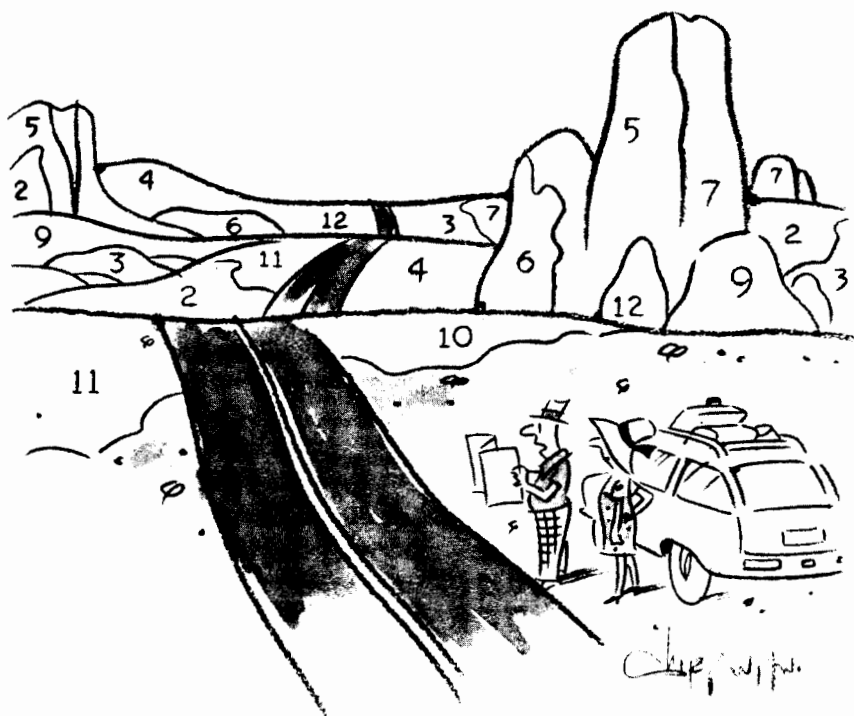
Emily Annis had a stroke, and is struggling to get back to good health.
