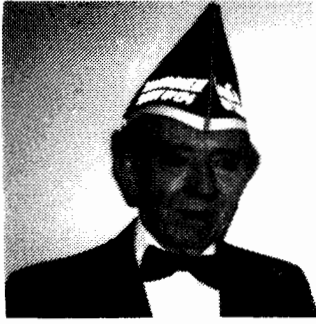
BROTHER CEDARS:


The budget meeting, consisting of present and newly elected officers, will be in December. Linda will let me know the date. I will let you know the date in my November newsletter.

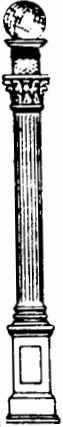

THE OBJECTS OF TALL CEDARISM

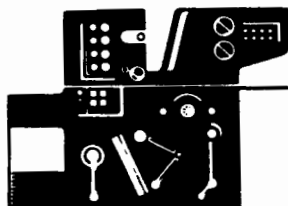
