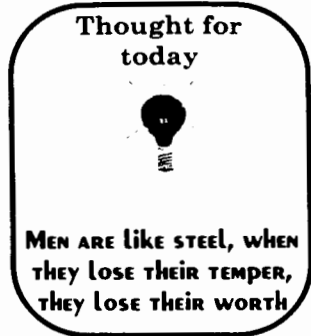

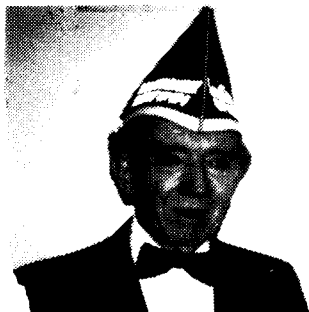

Nate's idea of a good time was to eat out and go to a movie. He had bad vision and had gone to a doctor who advised an operation. Nate put it off until his landlady called me. She said he was crying and bumping into things. I told her that I would come right over, but as soon as she hung up the phone Nate called me. He told me that he couldn't see and ask if I would take him to his doctor. I agreed and took him to Doctor's Hospital, or a building near it. A nurse came and took him and said she would take him from there. He had the operation and said he could see fine.
