He was hired and after awhile I found out he was an alcoholic. He was not cross addicted, as most were at that time.

Talking with Clyde I found out he had been an employee of a race track in Flordia. He said at one time he did like the fast life. He bet on the horses for years and did enjoy going to the track. He had been an accountant until his wife had a heart attack, this is when he moved to Flordia and took a job at the track.

His wife did not like Flordia so he moved back to Maryland. He could not get his old job back so he took a job as a clerk in an office.

Clyde said the pay was far less than he was used to and he wantedhis wife to have the finer things in life, he brooded for several months.

One evening at a friends house he saw a souvenier gun in a china closet. He waited until his friend left the room and then stole it.

He said he was determined to get more money for a house, vacation and new car. He took the gun and committed robbery.

Clyde said he drank quite alot then held up a gas station. This was so easy that he held up a 7-11 store. He ran into some trouble so he told the help he would kill them and their families. I'd rather see a sermon, than to hear it any day, I'd rather one walk with me, than to just show the way


