He was hired and after awhile I found out he was an alcoholic. He was not cross addicted, as most were at that time.

Talking with Clyde I found out he had been an employee of a race track in Florida. He said at one time he did like the fast life. He bet on the horses for years and did enjoy going to the track. He had been an accountant until his wife had a heart attack, this is when he moved to Florida and took a job at the track.

His wife did not like Florida so he moved back to Maryland. He could not get his old job back so he took a job as a clerk in an office.

Clyde said the pay was far less than he was used to and he wanted his wife to have the finer things in life, he brooded for several months.

One evening at a friends house he saw a souvenir gun in a china closet. He waited until his friend left the room and then stole it.

He said he was determined to get more money for a house, vacation and new car. He took the gun and committed robbery.

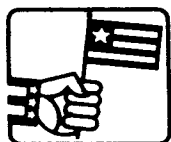
