FROM THE EAST

My Brothers,

This month's trestle board is a special Constitution Month edition, featuring articles about the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution, and the California Constitution. I hope you enjoy it.

The California Constitution:

The United States acquired California from Mexico in 1848 under the terms and conditions of the Treaty of Guadeloupe Hidalgo. Motivated by the discovery of gold in 1849, Congress acted swiftly to grant statehood. Backed by Brigadier Rilev General Bennett (California's military governor) 48 delegates convened a Constitutional Convention in Monterey. produced California's They first constitution, which was adopted in November 1849, before California was admitted to the Union on September 9, 1850 as the 31st state.

A second Constitutional Convention approved by voters in 1877 and it produced California's second constitution, which was adopted on May 7, 1879. This 1878 Constitution (apparently named for the 1878 Convention) remains in effect today, but it has been heavily amended and revised. It has been amended over 500 times and it underwent a 12 year revision process ending in 1974.

California's feature One key of Constitution is the ability of the voters to amendment through adopt the referendum and initiative process. The Legislature can propose constitutional amendments for voter approval via referendum. And voters can propose constitutional amendments via initiatives. This direct democracy is often blamed for California's unusually length of Constitution, which is eight times the length of the U.S. Constitution.

Serious efforts to convene a third Constitutional Convention began in 2008, when an editorial in the San Francisco Chronicle proposed such a convention. Efforts to place a Constitutional Convention initiative on a ballot have been unsuccessful so far.

The Grand Lodge of the state of California has deemed September Constitution Month

I will speak of the Masonic influence on the Declaration of Independence. Of the 56 signers, nine were Masons, William Ellery of Rhode Island, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania, John Hancock and Robert Treat Paine of Massachusetts, Joseph Hewes and William Hooper of North Carolina, Richard Stockton of New Jersey, George Walton of Georgia and William Whipple of New Hampshire.

A brief biography of the brothers:

William Ellery, born 12/22/1727, died 2/15/1820. Lawyer, educated at Harvard. Lawyer and judge.

Benjamin Franklin, born 1/17/1706, died 4/17/1790. No formal education but did receive Honorary Doctor of Law degrees from the Universities of Oxford and Edinburgh. Grand Master of Pennsylvania. John Hancock, born 1/12/1737, died 10/8/1793. Harvard. Merchant.

Joseph Hewes, born 1/23/1730, died 11/10/1779. Princeton. Merchant.

William Hooper, born 6/28/1742, died 10/14/1790. Princeton. Lawyer.

Robert Treat Paine, born 3/11/1731, died 5/11/1814. Harvard. Judge.

Richard Stockton, born 10/1/1730, died 2/28/1781. College of New Jersey. Lawyer.

George Walton, born 1741, died 2/2/1804. Self taught. Lawyer.

William Whipple, born 1/14/1730, died 11/28/1785. Common School of Kittery. Merchant, Soldier and Judge.

There you have it my brothers; Masons who signed the Declaration of Independence.

You may have noticed Fresno State was not represented in the list of institutions of higher learning. This is only because it was not established at the time of the founding of our great nation.

I look forward to sitting in lodge with you.

So if you are able to attend, we will again be helping Brother Tom Krummell fold and prepare the newsletter for mailing. We have done this a couple of times, and may see if it can be a regular event. It saves Tom a ton of time, and lets us "repay" the Lodge for all that they do for us, and takes less than an hour. <u>What makes up the per capita tax and assessments</u>: The per capita tax that we just paid totaled \$17.55 on 68 members. We actually have 85 members, but we are not charged the per capita tax on 17 members for various reason. We also paid an assessment of \$1.00 to General Grand Chapter on all 85 members. This brings the total amount of per capita taxes and assessments to \$18.55. It will <u>automatically</u> go up to \$19.05 for the 2013 - 2014 Chapter year.

On 68 members we pay (all of these amounts are per member): \$9.00 to Grand Chapter; \$2.00 to the Home Maintenance Fund; \$0.45 to the Benevolent Fund; \$0.25 to the Convention Fund; \$0.10 to the Scholarship Fund; \$5.75 to the Insurance Fund.

On 85 members we pay \$1.00 each.

There are other fees that we pay for each Initiate and Affiliate as well. These amounts are included in the fees we collect from Initiates and Affiliates, so the fees do not come out of our budget.

I will have a copy of the invoice at the September 10th meeting if anyone would like to "look it over".

Budget Committee: The budget committee for 2013 – 2014 is hard at work preparing our next budget, to be presented at the September 10th meeting.
