Halloween (10/31) originated from an ancient Celtic festival by the name of <u>Samhain</u>. It was believed that the living and the dead would meet on that day and that the local priest would receive prophecy that would direct their survival during the long and hard winter.

George Washington, The Mason

George Washington joined the Masonic Lodge Fredericksburg No. 4 as an Entered Apprentice at the age of 20 in November of 1752. His Masonic membership, like the others public titles and duties he performed, was expected from a young man of his social status in colonial Virginia. During the War for Independence, General Washington attended Masonic celebration and religious observances in several states. He also supported Masonic Lodges that formed within army regiments.

At his first inauguration in 1791, President Washington took his oath of office on a <u>Bible from St. John's Lodge in New York</u>. During his two terms, he visited Masons in North and South Carolina and presided over the <u>cornerstone ceremony</u> for the U.S. Capitol in 1793.

In retirement, Washington became charter Master of the newly chartered <u>Alexandria</u> <u>Lodge No. 22</u>, sat for a <u>portrait</u> in his Masonic regalia, and in death, was buried with Masonic honors.

Such was Washington's character, that from almost the day he took his Masonic obligations until his death, he became the same man in private that he was in public.

Masonic terms, he In remained "a just and upright Mason" and became a true Master Mason, Washington was, in Masonic terms, a "living stone" who became the cornerstone American civilization. He the milestone remains others civilizations follow into liberty and equality. He is Freemasonry's "perfect ashlar" which upon countless Master Masons gauge their labors in their own Lodges and in their own communities.

From the Secretary: At our September meeting, the budget committee presented the 2013-2014 budget (and it was approved by vote of the Chapter), and they decided to keep the Grand Chapter assessment amount of our dues at \$19.00. That means that our dues for 2014 will be: \$19.00 for the Grand Chapter fees and assessments PLUS \$20.00 Chapter dues for a total of \$39.00. <u>This and That:</u> I would like to take this opportunity to go over some OES terminology that is often confusing. When a Member belongs to two chapters in California, that member is a "plural" member. When a Member belongs to a California chapter and a chapter from another jurisdiction (state or country) that member is a "dual" member.

I was recently asked if the Chapter pays per capita taxes and assessments (the extra \$19.00 we started paying with our dues) on 50 year members? The answer is no, we do not pay per capita taxes on 50 year members. The only amount that we pay on 50 year members is a \$1.00 fee assessed on ALL members to General Grand Chapter that is included in the \$19.00.
