THE BIRTH OF THE TERRE HAUTE CONSISTORY

A great man once said, "If you want to do something, you can always find a way, if you don't, you can always find an excuse." We, here in the Valley of Terre Haute, seem to have been extremely fortunate, for we have been lead by men who, "can always find a way." Thus it is today, that we are the recipients of their labors. A small hand-full of men had a vision. A vision that Scottish Rite could grow and prosper here in western Indiana, and they found that way.

In the late 40's, several Brothers felt that the Terre Haute area had grown sufficiently to support a Valley of Scottish Rite. Until that time, Rite members of our Valley had been distributed to the Valley of Evansville and the Valley of Indianapolis.

Acting through and under the guidance of Ill. Bro. Henry Roberts, 33°, then Deputy for Indiana, they secured a dispensation and Charter for a Lodge of Perfection. This Charter, granted at the September 1951 Supreme Council, was presented on November 7, 1951, as well as a dispensation for the Samuel Dillon Jackson Council, Princes of Jerusalem.

At the end of the first infant year, the records show the valley had 846 Charter members, 292 demitted members, and 542 initiates, for a grand total in membership of 1680. Visits from other Valleys played an important role this first year, and the Valley is indebted to them for their assistance.

The next year, 1952, the Samuel Dillon Jackson Council, Princes of Jerusalem, received its Charter, and the Horace Eugene Tune Chapter of Rose Croix and the Terre Haute Consistory were granted their dispensations. To commemorate this occasion, a gala dinner was held on October 17th, at the Temple, attended by over 600 members to celebrate the event.

October 19, 1952, a reception was held at the Temple in honor of Mrs. Estelle Tune, to whom the valley owes such a great debt, for her contributions to our well being. The first complete convocation of our valley was held in the spring of 1953, in the months of February and March, and was witnessed by a excellent class of 165 members.

The evening of April 13, 1953, was a very special occasion for our Valley. This date marked the visit of the Sovereign Grand Commander, Ill. Bro. Melvin M. Johnson, 33°, accompanied by Ill. Bro. Harry G. Pollard, 33°, Grand Sword Bearer, and Ill. Bro. W. Henry Roberts, 33°, who were the guests of the Terre Haute Valley. Many other distinguished guests from other Valleys were present to make an extremely large delegation.

To complete the year 1953, the valley and trustees adopted a resolution establishing a building fund around a contribution of \$25,000, given to the Rite by Mrs. Tune. Even at this early date, our Valley was showing a propensity for membership development.

One of the most memorable events in the short history of the valley occurred on the night of November 20, 1953, when the Horace E. Tune Chapter of Rose Croix and the Terre Haute Consistory received their Charters. Many distinguished Brethren were present for the presentation, as the Chapter and Consistory were constituted in full form.
