EGIUS MANUSCRIPT

The oldest of the known manuscript charges of Freemasonry, written about 1390, is in the old English of Chaucer's time, and is very difficult to read. This old manuscript contains 15 articles and 15 points, of which the following is a free transcript, care being taken to convey the spirit of the thought rather than literary accuracy:

Articles

(1) The Master must be a trusty man, an honorable and impartial medium between the lords who hire and the operatives who labor.

(2) He must be punctual in his attendance at the assemblies.

(3) He must take no apprentice for a term of less than seven years.

(4) He must take no apprentices, save the free and well born.

(5) He must take no mutilated person for an apprentice.

(6) He must not take Craftsman's wages for apprentices' labor.

(7) He must take no immoral or depraved person for an apprentice.

(8) Finding an employee incompetent, he must immediately discharge him.

(9) He must undertake no work that he cannot finish.

(10) No master shall supplant another in his business.

(11) He shall not require his workmen to work by night, except in search of knowledge.

(13) He must instruct his apprentices in the Masonic science.

(14) The Master shall take no apprentices for whom he has not sufficient labor.

(15) He shall not compromise with his fellows in their sins for any profit.

Points

(1) The Mason must love God and his brethren.

(2) He must work diligently in working hours that he may lawfully refresh himself in the hours of rest.

(3) He must keep the secrets of the brethren with fidelity.

(4) He must be true to the Craft.

(5) He shall receive his wages without murmuring.

(6) He shall not turn a working day into a holiday.

(7) He shall not carnally lie with a brother's wife.

(8) He must be just and true to his Master and brethren in every capacity.

(9) He shall treat his brethren with equity and in the spirit of brotherly love.

(10) He must live peacefully and without contention with his brethren.

(11) Seeing a brother about to err he must admonish him with kindness.

(12) He must maintain the general regulations of the Craft.

(13) He shall commit no theft or succor a thief.

(14) He must be steadfast to these laws and to the laws of his country.

(15) He shall submit to the lawful penalty for what ever offenses he may commit.

TEXAS MASONIC HISTORY

"The M.W. Grand Lodge of Texas A. F. and A. M.

Office of the Grand Master 1501 Praetorian Building Dallas, Texas

September 24, 1921

To the Worshipful Master and Secretary

My Dear Brethren,

"I enclose two official communications to the Members of your Lodge together with a blank form to be filled out and mailed to me immediately after the meeting at which these communications are read."

"You are instructed to summons every member of your Lodge to this meeting, to be held on some evening selected by you to be the most convenient for your membership during the week beginning Monday, October 10th."

"... Please make it clear in your summons that the meeting is called under the instructions of the Grand Master and obedience to the summons is obligatory upon every member of the Lodge..."

Now when you receive a letter like that from the Grand Master of Texas, you know it's time to get serious. The Communications was four, 2 column pages, and in small print. The short version skipping the flowery language is as follows.

"... An Organization known as the Ku Klux Klan has recently come into this State and has become the subject of wide popular discussion. It appropriates the name and some of the methods of the original Ku Klux Klan, for the temporary existence of which there was ample excuse in the chaotic conditions, prevailing in the South immediately after the Civil War, because of which there was no protection to life and property until law and order were restored."

". . . It is a secret organization with a secret Membership, and therefore wholly irresponsible to the very government whose laws it claims to uphold."

"... The Ku Klux Klan is a serious menace to Masonry both internally and externally, and the

imminent dangers therefrom are causing the Masonic leadership of the Nation deep concern. It is because of this menace that I am compelled to speak plainly to all Texas Masons. The public in this and other states are holding Masonry responsible for the Klan. They have been given to understand that Masons compose the membership of the Klan to a very large degree and that the Klan is really a militant branch of Masonry, organized and operated by Masons to do things as Klansmen that it would not be proper for them to do as Masons. Organizers, speakers and members of the Klan are responsible for this belief among the people at large, which even to the school children in some of our cities and towns. Everywhere the Klansmen claim their membership is Masonic and everywhere the public charges the Klan to Masonry"

"... It is because of this deplorable situation that my sense of duty compels me to remind you that neither the Ku Klux Klan or any other order or organization is Masonic unless recognized as such by proper Grand Lodge authority. Nor will the tying of the Ku Klux Klan to Masonry by claims of Masonic membership be permitted or tolerated for one moment..."

This correspondence was found in some of the old minutes and papers in the Lodge. It just goes to show that a Masons life runs over a few speed bumps now and then.

If anyone would to read a copy of the full letter, it will be in the secretaries office, all four, 2 column small print pages of it.

It's Masonic Law In Texas Art. 331 (367) All Meetings Opened in Master's Degree.

At all meetings, the Lodge must be opened on the Master's Degree and if a stated meeting, the regular business transacted. If work in a lower degree is to be done the Masters Lodge must be called from labor and a Lodge opened on the proper degree. When the work is completed such lodge must be closed and labor resumed in the Master's Degree.
