Traveling Brother

Brethren,

My wife and I returned from a trip to Britain in mid November, where we had been vacationing for some seven weeks. During this time, we went on a cruise to the Mediterranean for eighteen days.

During our stay in Britain, I managed to visit two different Masonic Lodges. My first visit was to Sheaf Lodge, in Sheffield,

Yorkshire. My second visit was to Lodge St. Peter, Dore, Derbyshire. At both Lodges I was invited to attend their Stated Meeting, which is always followed by a first degree. Please note, all stated meetings are conducted in the first degree.

At both meetings I was amazed at the differences in our two rituals. Also the location of Lodge furniture. The altar is immediately below the WM's rostrum. The lesser lights are located (candles), one at the Master's station, and one each at each Warden's station. There were no pillars in the Lodge room. Most of the Brethren were dressed in black jackets, and gray striped pants. All wore white gloves. It looked very impressive.

My main reason for writing this article, is to point out what beautiful Lodges they were. When I think about what we have here in Honolulu, it makes me want to weep. Sheaf Lodge meets at this beautiful Tapton Hall. It is situated in large grounds, and was formerly the home of Florence Nightingale, of nursing fame. When you go in the front door, one is impressed with the royal blue carpeting in the lobby, with patterned gold Square and Compasses equally spaced over the whole area. There were several Lodge rooms. The one where our meeting was held had a pipe organ, with a professional organist. After our meeting, we retired to the bar, had a drink, and were then invited to dinner. The dining room, quite large, had a U shaped table set up. The Master sat in the middle of the U in a large chair, and the newly obligated Apprentice Mason on his right. At each end of the U, sat the Senior and Junior Wardens, also in big high chairs. We had a lovely dinner, followed by toasts to just about everybody. It was really nice. During this period, The Entered Apprentice's Song was sung by the Brethren for the benefit of the newly obligated candidate. A good time was had by all.

This Tapton Hall is home to 26 Lodges. So it has several Lodge rooms, several practice rooms, three restaurants and three bars. In fact the place is open to the public during the week, where they serve lunches.

My whole point in writing this article is to ask every Mason in Honolulu, why can't we

have a really nice Lodge that we can all enjoy? How would we do this? By getting together all the Lodges, and pooling our resources. OK, some Lodges have plenty of money and others have none. But remember the basic tenets of Masonry – Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. Let's pool our resources and build something that we can be very proud of and enjoy, and even give the Grand Lodge a permanent home.
