for someone else.


To All Grand Tall Ceders and Supreme Forest Officers:

Your National Objective Committee has met and discussed

many plans for a National Objective, but has not been able to find any which they unanimously concur is the best for Tall Cedarism. They do believe, however, that somewhere in the local Forests is a MAN WITH THE IDEA that is far superior to any that the committee has proposed. In order that they might obtain that idea, Supreme Tall Cedar Herman Willaredt is offering a prize of \$100 TO THE INDIVIDUAL who proposes the idea finally accepted by the Supreme Forest as the National Objective. Here's how you can gain recognition for you Forest!

1. A night should be designated as National Objecttive Night. The suggestor, or one designated by him, should explain his idea to the Forest.

- 2. The Forest shall vote on the several ideas suggested and the Scribe shall submit the idea receiving the most votes to the Chairman of the National Objective Committee before April 25, 1949
- 3. In the event that a suggestor does not receive the most votes in his Torest and still believes his idea has merits, he may submit his idea in writing, direct to the Supreme Tall Cedar for further consideration,
- 4. The National Objective Committee will review all ideas and select not less than 3 which in their judgment merits presentation to the Supreme Forest Convention assembled in May. After hearing these ideas, the Supreme Forest members shall by standing vote, decide as to whether any one of the ideas is worthy of adoption, or whether they should all be rejected.
- 5. If the ideas are voted as worthy, the Convention shall, by vote, select the best idea. The individual who conceived the winning idea will be awarded a prize of \$100,000.
- 6. In the event that the Convention votes that all ideas be rejected no prizes will be awarded.


