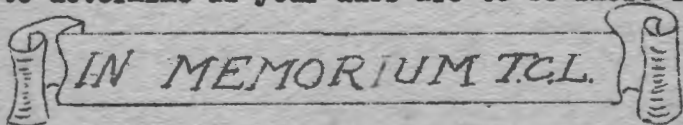


DUES      DUES      DUES      ARE DUE

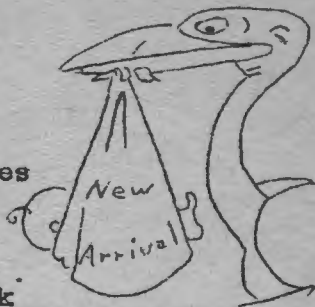
