The Echo wants to thank each and everyone of you ladies for giving the Grand Tall's wife your support to help make it a success again this year.

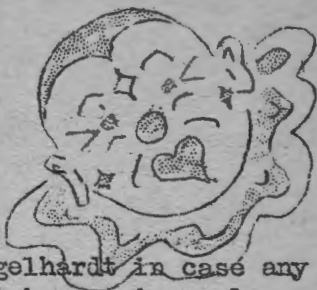
WE ARE ON THE HONOR ROLL
