To those who could not get there, this is your new Grand Tall, who, on the stroke of midnight, appeared in this outfit.

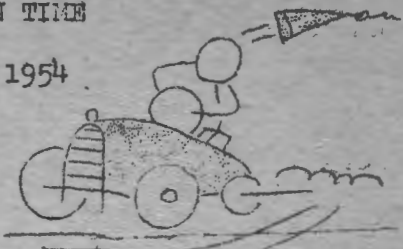
