He is presently serving as Deputy Illustrious Master of King Solomon Council No. 13, Royal and Select Masters, Rockville, Md.

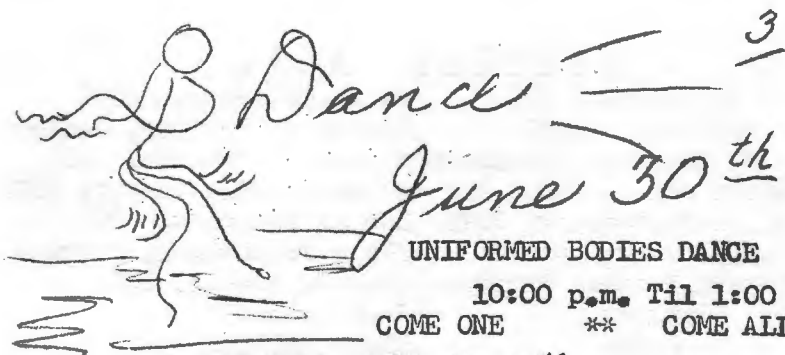

Good Luck Leo in your new assignment.

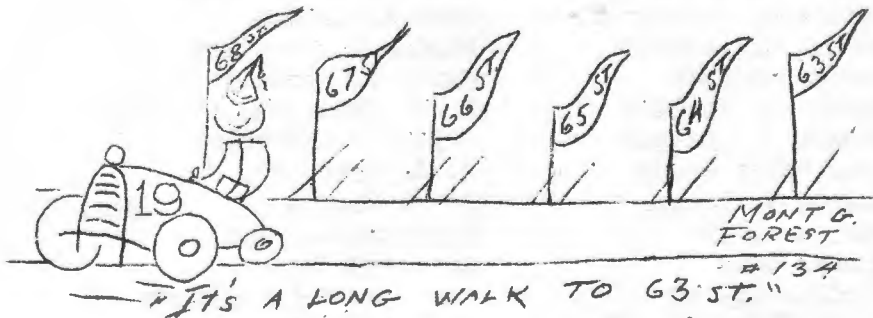

Congratulations also to you J. Myron on your new job.

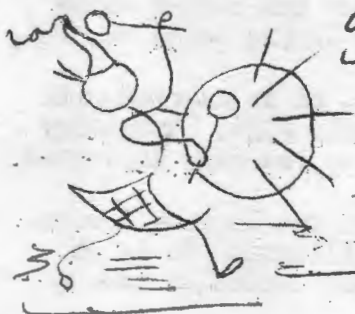
PAST GRAND TALL'S NIGHT
