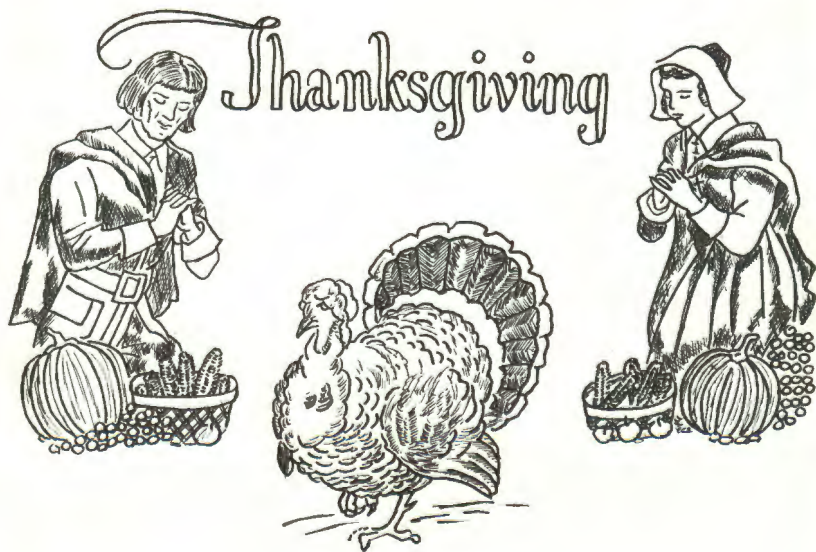

Hope we got all the unfortunates. Here is wishing you all a quick return to good health.

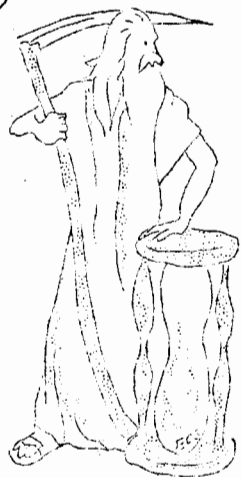

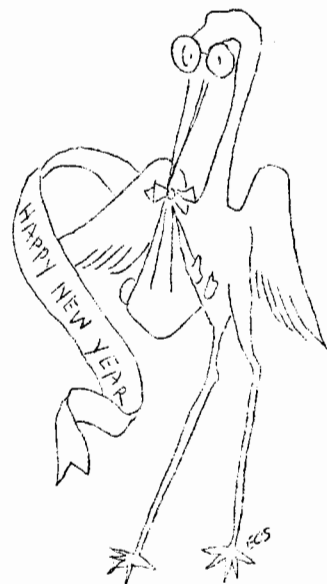

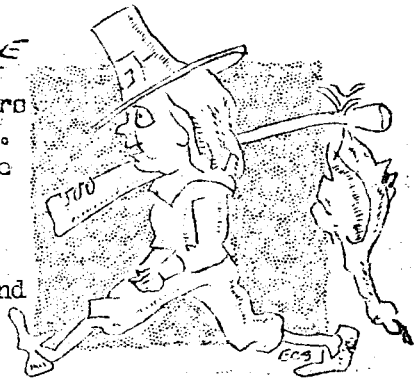
