Bill had been at work every day and seemed fine. I had driven a van home, it was plain and dark blue. I was disappointed and mad with Bill, so I went looking for him. I drove in places I would not go in broad daylight, but no Bill. I went over to his wives house and in the mean time a call had come in from the local hospital that Bill had been brought in unconscious. There was no need to go that night he was in intensive care.

The next afternoon he came to and on the 2nd day I visited him. He was shaking and thin but otherwise looked good. He said, "I got off on the wrong foot and drank too much. The doctor wants me to stay for a few days but I'll be at work tomorrow." I told him he could walk out of the hospital that very day if he wanted to. If he did I told him I did not want him to come near me and he would be fired.

But if he stayed there 2 weeks and then went to ++++ for a month his pay would continue, it would be given to his wife, and when he came back he would have a job. He broke down and cried like a baby. "I'm fine" he said. I didn't pay any attention, I told him when he came back he would have to go to counselling to overcome the addiction.

Bill stayed at the hospital and he went to ++++ for a month. I visited him quite often, so did his wife and baby.

When he returned he attended AA every night for Months, he joined a small church group and to this day he is clean and doing just fine.

Gods power was there.

SUBJECT: Proposed By-Laws amendment

Proposed: to amend Article VII, para (d) as follows:

(d) Ten (10) members shall constitute a quorum in all meetings of the forest. (This now reads: twenty (20) members).

Proposed: to amend Article X, para (a) as follows:

(a) An initiation fee of Forty dollars (\$40.00) shall accompany all petitions for original membership; an initiation fee of Twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall accompany all petitions for affiliation. These fees included dues for the year of application. (This now reads: An initiation fee of Thirty-seven dollars (\$37.00) and the cost of a Pyramid shall accompany all petitions for original membership; an initiation fee of Twenty dollars (\$20.00) and the cost of a Pyramid shall accompany all petitions for affiliation).

Proposed: to amend Article X, para (b) as follows:

This now reads: The annual dues shall be Twenty dollars (\$20.00), two dollars of which shall go to the Tall Cedar Foundation Fund, payable in advance on or before January 1st of the year for which due.

Proposed: to amend Article X para (c) as follows:

Paragraph (c) to be removed and by-laws (d), (e), (f) and (g) to be relettered. (This now reads: Applicants for membership who are initiated, reinstated or affiliated during the first six months of the year shall pay annual dues of twenty dollars (\$20.00); during the last six months of the year, they shall pay annual dues of Twelve dollars (\$12.00), two dollars of which shall go to the Tall Cedar Foundation).

These changes to be effective the date they are vote on at the next forest meeting. This changes where read at the June 19, 1993 meeting and will be read and vote on at the meeting on September 18, 1993

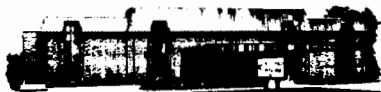

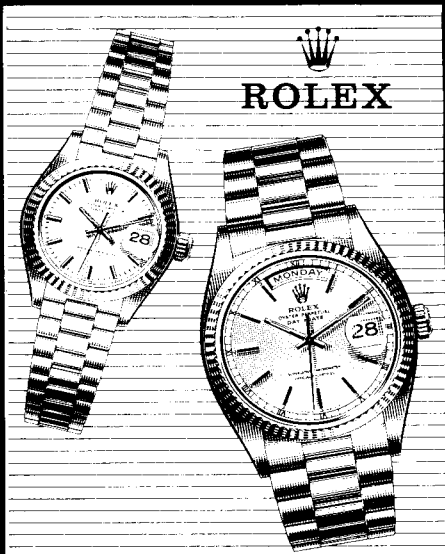
