

Ralph had a record of several crimes. He had been in prison for over 15 years. Ralph was not a good prisoner, he was rebellious and considered dangerous. I knew the Chief of Probation and Parole and so if I took one of his charges, one I wanted and got, the prisoner agreement stated that I could visit them, day or night. I wanted to see if they truly were living a life as they had said they wanted.

I did take Ralph as a worker. The prison chaplain told me Ralph wanted to go straight, he was a christian and had made it clear to the chaplain that he had accepted Christ and was a changed man.

On Ralph's first day he would ask me how much to pay for bus fare and how much a meal should cost. It was as if every outside move he made he had to ask about it. I visited him several nights and he seemed to be a good citizen. I made him understand that I would be with him at work over eight hours a day and that many nights I would drop in on him. He had no problem with this in fact he was very courteous to me. He did not show any problems that I was told he might have.

Ralph was a good employee, but he always seemed confused about the outside world. He would get my advice on almost all of his actions. I got the feeling the man looked up to me as his advisor.

Ralph worked about six months and then one day he was absent. I thought he may not feel good so I waited two more days and then I went to his apartment, he was not there. No one seemed to know where he was. On the third day I called the jail and sure enough he was there. He was not picked up by the police. He had entered on his own and asked that his parole be vacated.

Ralph left his glasses at the shop so I took them to the jail for him. He said "I thank you for all you have done for me. Thanks for being someone I never knew. I never had a father and if I could pick one it would be you. I can't live on the outside. I've lived in here too long. I can't cope out there. In here they tell me what to wear, what to eat and

when to go to bed and I understand jail life. I guess I'll be an inmate till I die, but I'll always be a christian and I'll never forget you!"

Ralph is still in jail, I visit him now and then, he seems very content. Some can't adjust to the civilian life.






