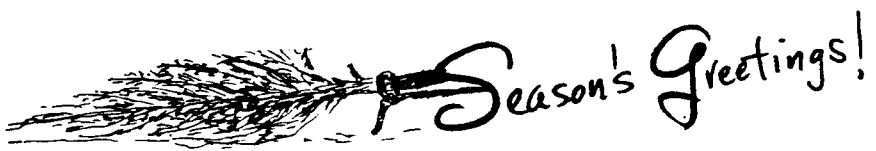

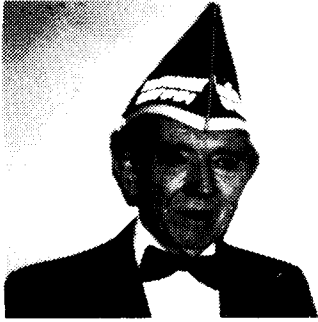

I recently left an older mans home, he was in his eighties. As I left he said "Please don't forget me, come back and see me. They rarely come by and they just stay for a few minutes. I try to act like it doesn't bother me, but inside I really hurt. I hope you are never alone, when your family and friends forget you."

My visit to another man who had just lost his wife. He said "I hate to be alone. I think about the past too much. I can't play certain songs because the memories are too much to bear. I try to hide my feelings but I can't, I guess they show. I have more money than I'll ever use. What I really need are close friends." I could see the pain and frustration and the anger over his loss. His expression was so strong. As he talked he tried to maintain control over his true feelings.

These are but two of so many lonely people. We forget the meaning of yhis time of year and what God intends us to do.

I am so very thankful that I can hear my wife in the house, that we can talk and see each other. Many times I think of what I call luxury; a wife, love, a home, children who have done so very well and yet I know some day this may change, I hope I can cope as God would have me. 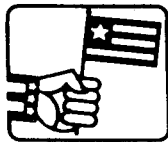

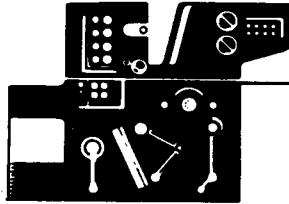
