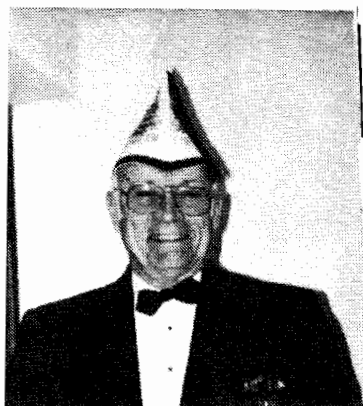

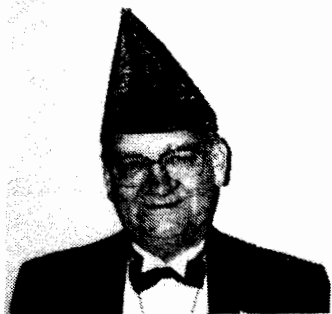
BROTHER CEDARS

Jim was only sixteen and already he was using cocaine and alcohol. His mother was in tears as she told me of his condition. "Please help him if you can."

I did find Jim and invited him to come to my office. He came in about 3:00 PM one day and the first thing he said was "I don't want no job, I'm just fine."

I asked Jim to listen to me just for a short time. I told how I knew his dad, he was an alcoholic. I went to see him when he was in the hospital, he was picked up by the police unconscious. I tried to work with him and each time he said "I'm through, I'm sober from here on out." Only a week and again he was in the hospital, he was picked up unconscious. I hired him only to find he didn't report for work but was found dead, an overdose of alcohol. "Jim your mother has been through alot and only you can make her proud and happy. I think this is what you want, deep down inside. I know you don't want a life of misery as your dad knew it. I didn't get to him in time. Maybe I have reached you before it is too late."

You can visit all the churches, Temples or Mosques, to find God. You will be disappointed he can only be found in your heart. You are his disciples and as you act out your life you should be doing God's work. Remember you may be the only Bible some people ever read.

THE OBJECTS OF TALL CEDARISM
