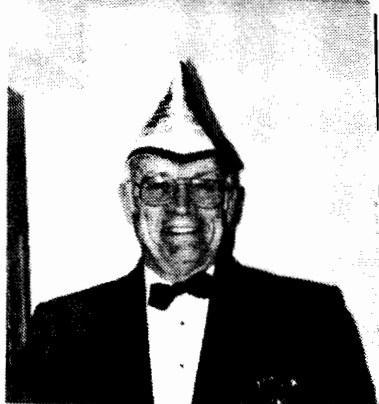

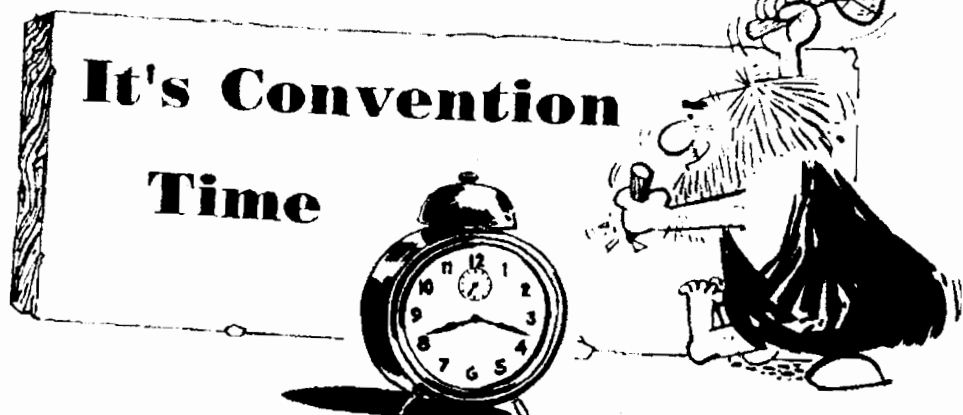

I told him I could fire him but I would'nt, instead he would give up booze and drugs completely. If he failed to do this he would be put back in jail.

Abner was cautious in his first few days back. One day he came to me and said, "Nobody ever wanted me, no one ever talked to me the way you do. You are mean to me but I think you care about me". I assured him I did care and if he wanted to continue working with me he would *have* to stop all drinking of alcohol and no drugs, as I had told him before. He told me that he wanted the job and said that he wanted to pattern his life after me.

THE OBJECTS OF TALL CEDARISM
