

Brothers of Shawnee Lodge, for those of you who don't know me I'd like to introduce myself as your Senior Deacon for 2017, Brother Roger Dowell. As this new year and new office begins I find myself contemplating many things about Masonry and the duties required, and I've surprised even myself at some of the revelations that have resulted. I appeal to the expertise of the Masonic scholars among us to correct any inaccurate observations to which I may have arrived, but I feel confident that good "Masonic sense" and intentions have prevented me from straying too far outside of our common usage.
