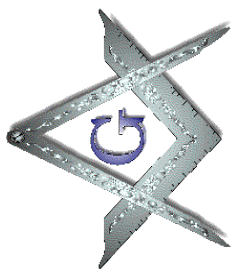

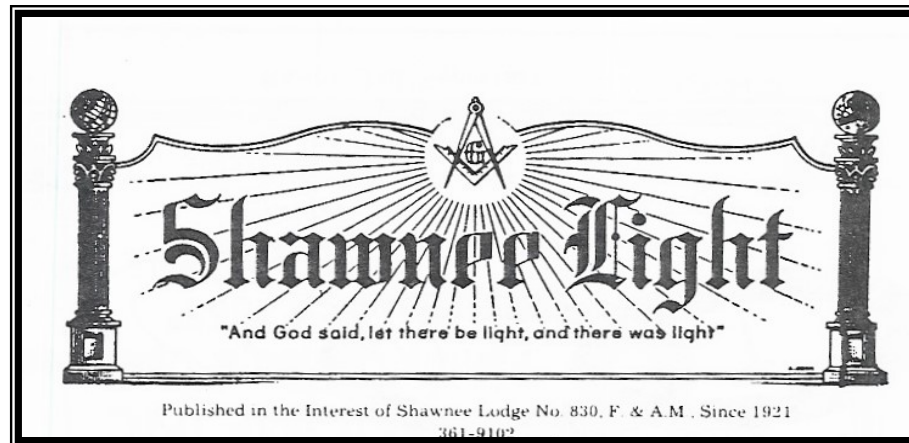

Ingredients stuffing meatloaf

- 1 package Stove Top stuffing any flavor
- 1 cup hot water
- 2 packets brown gravy mix divided use
- 1.5 pounds ground beef
- 1 cup cold water
- 2 large eggs beaten

Instructions

1. In a medium sized bowl add stuffing mix and 1 cup of hot water and let sit 5 minutes.
2. In a separate bowl, mix 1 package of brown gravy mix with cold water.
3. Combine ground beef, mixed gravy and egg.
4. After the stuffing has sat for 5 minutes and cooled, incorporate the stuffing mix into the ground beef mixture.
5. Grease a bundt pan with non stick spray and then press the ground beef mixture into the pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 45-55 minutes or until no longer pink inside
6. Once baked, rest for 5 minutes while preparing the second package of gravy and then invert onto a plate.
7. Serve with mashed potatoes and brown gravy in the center of the meatloaf.
