5. That we will not have to vote to suspend anyone this year for non-payment of dues.
6. To form a chorus under the direction of Brother George Satterlee to sing at the Masonic Home when we visit on May 14, to sing at our Annual Awards Night on May 28th, and to record and market and Album entitled "In God We Trust" - the proceeds of which will be donated to the Masonic Charity Foundation.
7. Appointment of a committee to begin planning and fund raising for the celebration of the New Jersey Masonic BiCentennial.

I'll try to keep you informed of our progress on these objectives in subsequent trestleboards. Of course a better way would be your attendance and participation in the Lodge activities. Also the next trestleboard will contain this year's plans for our lodge building.

As space permits we'll also try to include the names of those brethren who'll be celebrating their masonic birthdays. At the last regular meeting two of the thirty brethren whose masonic birthdays were in January were present and recognized. In February there are twenty-seven celebrating, all of whom I would like to greet and recognize from the East.

One of our members, Brother Clifford White has just recently retired (at the young age of 88) and moved to Florida. Brother White - all our best wishes and may God continue to richly bless you.
