Anyone who has lived in South Jersey for any length of time is aware of Millville's reputation for singing. The area has produced many really good choruses and quartets. Even Shekinah was known for its chorus at one time.

The key to a good chorus or quartet is the harmony it produces. While each member may have an excellent voice, there is no harmony until all the voices are blended together. The Leads carry the melody, while the Base and tenor sections are the corresponding harmony notes. The fourth part, that of the Baritone, while it may at times seem unimportant, is the part that makes the chord complete. Each voice adding his part, blending and complimenting each other, until the result is music that will thrill the heart and send shivers running up and down your spine! However, if a voice is missing or hits a wrong note or is singing a different song altogether, there is no chord and the harmony is missing. Oh, the chorus is still a chorus and the song they are singing would probably be understandable; but the close harmony, for which they are noted, would be missing.

It's the same with any organization, whether it be four or four hundred. Without each person doing his part, there is no organization. In ours its the Principal Tenets of Free Masonry that is our theme and its the Officers and Past Masters that are changed with adding the tenor and base. But as in the case of the baritones in the chorus, the sound is not complete without the membership. The melody is just notes on paper unless there is someone to sing them and the chord is not complete without all the parts.

So, I say to all; fall in, sound your "A", and lets make some beautiful music. Remember, peace and harmony are the strength and support of all institutions, especially this of ours.
