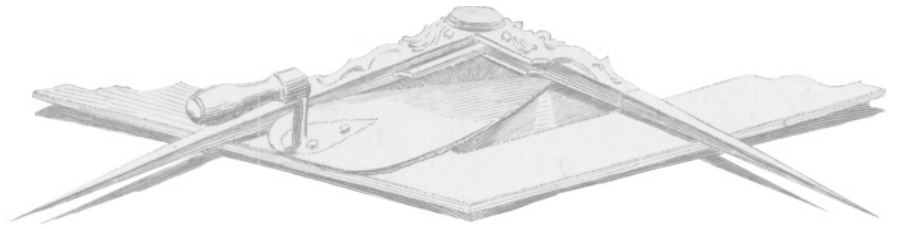
Lodge will start promptly at 7:30, please come a little early to prepare for the meeting.
