Masonic Funerals

Brothers.

I would like to address a subject that many of us don't much care to deal with and that's death. On June 30^{th} 2010, I performed my 123^{rd} Masonic Funeral that seems like a lot but I have attended over 400 in my Masonic career, and I only been in for 17 years.

In the past few months we have had 8 members pass away who requested Masonic Funerals.

Brother Tom Mercer has stepped up and has learned the funeral ritual, and I for one am very thankful he has. When I was asked to learn this I was Junior Warden and that was in 1996. I was told then by some of the Past Masters that it was expected of a good Master to be able to do the Masonic Funeral the year you are Master. Well it took me over a year to learn it well enough to be able to do it in front of others. At that time there was 4 of us that could do it, but like it or not some of them have given up due to age and death, and I became the only one for a few years until now.

In the 12 years that I have been doing them there was one I could not do and we had to get a brother from another lodge to do it, and that's the night my mother passed away. I have done these on Brother's who have meant a lot to me, and those were the hardest, I done them on Brothers I never knew, and I have done them on Brothers when I was sick, and last year I had to leave a family event and go do one, but I was instructed by Brother John Rupley when I first started doing Masonic Funerals; he explained to me whether you want to do it or not, it is the last thing we can do for our Brother so we are obligated to do this for him--even if he's not an active member or if he's not a member of Suburban as long as he a Mason in good standing.

It is nice to see that the attendance is starting to get better; here a while back there was a time that only a few showed up. I understand that things come up and you not able to attend all of them but an effort should be made to attend as many as you can. Just stop and consider who is going

to be there when you drop those working tools of your busy life and entered that Lodge above, who is going to call the brothers to assembly for your final farewell, who is going to say those words over you, and who is going to accompany your remains to your final resting place.

We know it won't be you...and it may not be me. I didn't know I had the choice: I have been under the impression that I was a Mason and he was my Brother.

History From the South

Greetings,

Brothers and friends of Suburban Lodge, my name is Danny Davis and I have been a member of Suburban Lodge for just a little over two years.



I have bet a great group of fine people here and would like to share some small bits of history with you. I am also a member of The Sons of Confederate Veterans, and hope you understand my Southern sympathy whenever I speak on or about the Southern cause.

The lodge of Masons in which George Washington was "initiated, passed and raised," Fredericksburg, Virginia No. 4 was pillaged in 1862 by Federal troops. The lodge safe was blown open and the records, regalia, jewels, etc were carried off. Among the articles taken was an old cherished jewel of solid silver in the form of a level highly prized by the lodge for its antiquity. The relic was discovered some twenty years later after the war in the safe of Integrity Lodge No. 158, A.F. & A.M of Philadelphia. It had been placed in the safe by a former member of the lodge who had recovered it from the soldier who originally pilfered it from the Fredericksburg lodge.

A note was tacked to the jewel with the instructions that the jewel be returned to the Fredericksburg lodge when the state of Virginia should cease to be in open rebellion against the Government of the United States. The jewel has since been returned to the Fredericksburg Lodge. I hope this little part of history makes you appreciate our brotherhood a little bit more.

I have been published in many periodicals over the years, and asked for advice from dear old dad on more than one occasion concerning my grammar, or lack thereof. Several years ago, I asked my father a very serious question. 
