

## Rowland's Ramblings

I have been writing this column for the Suburban Newsletter for more than twenty years now, and have had requests from some of our members who have joined Suburban since that time to repeat some of the early columns. Here is the very first one.

## ROWLAND'S RAMBLINGS MARCH - APRIL 1990.

And since there were no restrictions to the offer these ramblings will not necessarily be of a Masonic nature.

The idea crept slowly into my scarcely haired cranium when I overheard a conversation between several of our 'knife and fork' masons during one of our coffee and doughnut klatches in the upstairs lounge, commonly called the "Liars Lobby." One of our opinioned past masters (aren't all Past Masters opinionated?) thought that most local newsletters and

My "Old Philosopher" column is still popular because the era is mostly gone now, and people still like to reminisce. I will probably never stop writing.
