# DID YOU KNOW (about Gordon Cooper)

Leroy Gordon Cooper, Jr., also known as Gordo Cooper, (March 6, 1927 - October 4, 2004) was an engineer and American astronaut. Out of 109 pilots considered in the original selection process, Cooper was one of the seven and youngest original astronauts selected for Project Mercury, the first manned space effort by the United States. Cooper was launched into space on May 15, 1963 aboard the Mercury-Atlas 9 (Faith 7) spacecraft, the last Mercury mission. He orbited the Earth 22 times and logged more time in space than all five previous Mercury astronauts combined - 34 hours. 19 minutes and 49 seconds, traveling 546,167 miles at 17,547 mph, pulling a maximum of 7.6 g's . He achieved an altitude of 165.9 statute miles at apogee. He was the first American astronaut to sleep not only in orbit but on the launch pad during a countdown and was the last American to be launched alone into Earth orbit and conduct an entire solo orbital mission.

In his lifetime Cooper received many awards including the Air Force Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross with oak leaf clusters, the NASA Exceptional Achievement Medal, the Collier Trophy, the Harmon Trophy, the DeMolay Legion of Honor, the John F. Kennedy Trophy, the Iven C. Kincheloe Award, the University of Hawaii Regents Medal and the Columbus Medal. He was a **Master Mason** (member of Carbondale Lodge 82 in Carbondale, Colorado) and was given the honorary **33rd Degree by the Scottish Rite Masonic body.** 

Cooper was a member of several groups and societies including the Society of Experimental Test Pilots, the American Astronautical Society, **Scottish Rite, York Rite, Shriners,** Rotary Club, Order of Daedalians, Confederate Air Force and Boy Scouts of America.
