Brethren, Many of you will be receiving requests for humanitarian relief for Haiti. Please be aware that the Haiti tragedy is a scenario for waste and fraud. Be careful where and how you send your limited charitable resources.

The Grand Lodge of Texas policy is to react to notification from the Masonic Service Association. Dick Fletcher (Executive Secretary, MSA) is working a notification to alert the Grand Lodges for monetary contributions. Note: the MSA is a 501-C-3 organization that handles the funds very prudently. Upon receipt of the MSA notice, the Grand Secretary will put out a Grand Lodge appeal to all Texas Lodges. Likewise, I recommend that if any Lodge or Texas Mason that wants to make a donation of non-perishable goods to do so through the Salvation Army or Red Cross, both of whom have a reputable logistics system to transport the goods to Haiti.

I have requested the Internet Committee distribute this information to all Texas Masons that have signed up for electronic communications from the Grand Secretary, and also create a notice for the Grand Lodge Web Site.
